## AN ACT

To prevent the issuing of bank notes of a certain amount.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That from and after the passage of this act, it shall not be lawful for any bank within this commonwealth, to create or put in circulation, or continue in circulation, any note, bill, check, ticket or paper purporting to be a bank note, or of the nature or appearance of a bank note, of any denomination between five and ten, ten and twenty, or twenty and fifty dollars.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That any bank offending against the provisions of the first section of this act, shall be subject to the penalties prescribed for issuing notes of a less denomination than one dollar, in and by an act entitled "An act to prevent the making, issuing and re-issuing and circulating certain description of notes and tickets in the nature of bank notes, and for other purposes," passed March twenty-second, eighteen hundred and seventeen, which penalties shall be enforced in the manner directed by said act, and for the uses therein expressed.

SECT. 3. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That all the provisions of the act entitled "An act concerning small notes for the payment of money," passed the twelfth day of April, eighteen hundred and twenty-eight, are hereby extended to bank notes of any denomination between five and ten, ten and twenty, and twenty and fifty dollars.
