AN ACT

Relative to the election of constables in certain townships in the counties of Cumberland and Perry.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That so much of the act passed the fourteenth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighteen, entitled "An act authorising the election of certain constables," as relates to the election of constables in East Pennsborough township, in the county of Cumberland, and that so much of the act passed the ninth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-five, entitled "An act authorising the election of constables in certain townships, and for other purposes," as relates to the election of constables in Rye township, in the county of Perry, be and the same are hereby repealed.

Repeal of certain acts, so far as relates to the townships of E. Pennsborough and Rye.

AN ACT

Explanatory of the act entitled "An act relative to the patenting of lands," passed the eighth day of April, A. D. one thousand eight hundred and twenty-nine.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That in all cases where the moneys due for the patenting of lands have been secured by mortgage to the common-

wealth, and the whole or any part thereof is unpaid, the Secretary of the Land Office shall deduct from the amount due the commonwealth, the interest charged on the purchase money of any lands, for the time which elapsed between the second day of December, one thousand seven hundred and seventy-six, and the second day of December, one thousand seven hundred and eighty-three: *Provided*, That the lien of the commonwealth on said lands, shall not be in any way affected by this act.

AN ACT

To authorise the president and managers of the Ridge Turnpike to grant to the corporation of Spring Garden, so much of the Ridge Turnpike as lies within the district of Spring Garden, upon the conditions hereinafter specified, and for other purposes.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That it shall be lawful for the president and managers of the Ridge turnpike company, to grant to the corporation of Spring Garden so much of said road as lies within the district of Spring Garden, and that the same be hereafter named or known as Wissahiccon Avenue.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That from and after the passing of this act, it shall be lawful for the district of Spring Garden to take under their control and management, so much of said road as is hereby intended to be granted, with full powers to alter the regulation of the same and the streets connected therewith, and of placing culverts along or crossing the said road, for carrying off the surplus water; and that the commissioners of the district be and they are
