missioners of the district of Spring Garden, to take under their control and exclusive jurisdiction, all streets, lanes or alleys now opened or hereafter to be opened, within the said district, to introduce the Schuylkill water, and to regulate, pave and govern the same, and assess the cost of so doing on the owners of the adjoining real estate, in all respects and in like manner and effect as may or can now be done in relation to the streets, lanes or alleys as heretofore by law laid out and established: *Provided always*, That this section shall not be construed to extend to any street, lane or alley of less than twenty feet in width.

Proviso.

Extension of
Broad street.

SECT. 7. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid*, That the commissioners of the district of Spring Garden be and they are hereby authorised to open Broad street, from the intersection of Callowhill and Broad streets to the Ridge road, of the same width as it now is between Vine and Callowhill streets, and cause the same to be levelled and paved as soon as conveniently may be, the expense and cost of the same to be assessed and paid in like manner and under the same regulations as are now in force and provided for levelling and paving streets within the said district.

A FURTHER SUPPLEMENT

To the act entitled "An act for the prevention of vice and immorality, and of unlawful gaming, and restraining disorderly sports and dissipation," passed twenty-second April, seventeen hundred and ninety-four.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same*, That if any person or persons, after the first day of June next, shall cause to fight any cock or cocks, for money or any other valuable thing, or shall promote or en-

courage any match or matches of cock fighting by betting thereon, every such person so offending, shall, upon conviction thereof before any mayor's court or court of quarter sessions of the proper city or county, forfeit and pay the sum of forty dollars for every such offence, one half thereof to the use of the informer and the other half to the use of the poor of the proper city or county, in which poor-houses have been or may be erected, and when no poor-house shall be erected, to the use of the poor of the city, borough or township in which the offence shall be committed; and in default of payment of the fine aforesaid, the offender shall be committed to prison, for any period not exceeding thirty days, at the discretion of the court before which the conviction shall take place: *Provided further*, That such information shall be made within forty-eight hours after the commission of the offence.

AN ACT

To incorporate the Fire Insurance Company of Northampton county.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the persons who have associated themselves into a Fire Insurance company, in and near the borough of Easton, in the county of Northampton, by the name of "The Fire Insurance Company of Northampton county," with such persons, being citizens of the United States, as shall hereafter be admitted members thereof, in the manner hereinafter provided, shall be and they hereby are created and made a body politic and corporate,
