

fine, the costs of prosecution, and undergo an imprisonment in the jail of said county, and that in pursuance of said sentence, the said Jesse Smith was compelled to pay said costs, and undergo an imprisonment for almost nine months, and incurred considerable other expenses, all of which was manifestly unjust :

Therefore,

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the county commissioners of Bradford county be and they are hereby authorised and required to adjust and settle the reasonable claims of the said Jesse Smith, for the costs and expenses which he has been obliged to pay, in pursuance of his conviction and sentence on the said indictment, and allow him such amount as they shall adjudge just and right, which amount, after having been approved by the auditors of said county, shall be paid by order or orders drawn in the usual manner on the treasurer of said county of Bradford.

AN ACT

For the relief of Catherine Cryder and Elizabeth Budding, widows of revolutionary soldiers.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the State Treasurer be and he is hereby authorised and required to pay to Catherine Cryder, of Cumberland

AN ACT

Making further appropriations for canals and roads.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,*

That it shall be the duty of the canal commissioners to cause so much of the contracts already made upon the different lines of the canals and rail-road as can be done, to be completed within the present year, for which and to aid in the payment of the temporary loans heretofore made, and applied to canal and rail-road purposes, and also to aid in defraying the expenses incident to canals and rail-roads, the sum of three millions four hundred and fifty-nine thousand five hundred and thirty-two dollars is hereby appropriated.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the different routes for crossing the Allegheny mountain, by a portage road, shall be carefully viewed and examined by three experienced and skilful engineers, to be selected by the board of canal commissioners; which said engineers or a majority of them, after having view-
