AN ACT

For the relief of Samuel Gibson and William Riddles, late supervisors of Nippenose township, in the county of Lycoming, and John Vanhorn, late supervisor of Perry township, Jefferson county.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That it shall be the duty of the supervisors elected for the year eighteen hundred and thirty, for the townships of Adams and Nippenose, to assess and collect and they are hereby authorised and required to assess and collect and pay over, for the use of a judgment which Henry Antis holds against Samuel Gibson and William Riddles, late supervisors, such sum or sums of money as may appear due or to have been due at the time of settlement with said supervisors.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That in the assessment and collection aforesaid shall be included those parts of the townships of Nippenose and Adams, in Lycoming county, which were within the bounds of Nippenose when the debt was contracted.

SECT. 3. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the auditors of Young and Perry townships, in Jefferson county, be and they are hereby authorised and required to audit and settle the accounts of John Vanhorn, as supervisor of Perry township, previous to its division into the said townships of Perry and Young, and to apportion the balance found due him on settlement between the said townships, and to grant their respective orders on the supervisors of said townships, in favor of the said John Vanhorn, for the balance found due him so apportioned.
