AN ACT

For the relief of Robert Hodge and Daniel Clark, of Mercer county.

Preamble.

WHEREAS, the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, on the twelfth day of September, seventeen hundred and ninety, issued a patent to Michael Henderliter, assignee of John Whiteman, a soldier of the revolutionary war, for a certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in the county of Allegheny, and numbered seven hundred and sixty-three, in the fourth district of donation lands, which was since conveyed to Robert Hodge, to wit, on the twenty-ninth day of April, eighteen hundred and sixteen, for the sum of four hundred dollars: *And whereas*, it has since been ascertained by due course of law, that the patent the date of which is recited above, issued in mistake on the part of the commonwealth, and in fraud or mistake on the part of John Whiteman, the said Whiteman having on the eighteenth day of April, seventeen hundred and eighty-seven, obtained a patent from the commonwealth, for another tract in the ninth district of donation land, which said tract is numbered seventeen hundred

and seventy-six: *And whereas also*, The heirs of Robert Parker, who was a soldier of the revolutionary war, have by due course of law as aforesaid, recovered the tract or lot numbered seven hundred and sixty-three, from the said Robert Hodge and Daniel Clark, who held under the said Hodge, at great expense and loss to the said Hodge and Clark, on the ground of mistake or fraud as before mentioned:

Therefore,

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the State Treasurer be and he is hereby authorised and required to pay to Robert Hodge and Daniel Clark, of Mercer county, to their order, or their legal representatives, the sum of five hundred dollars, out of any money in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated. §500 granted.
