AN ACT

Refunding to Thomas Jones certain moneys expended by him, in the improvement of the river Susquehanna

WHEREAS, By the sixth section of the act for the improvement of the state, passed twenty-sixth March, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-one, the sum of two thousand five hundred dollars was appropriated for improving the navigation of the river Susquehanna, from the mouth of the Swatara to Juniata river, and Elisha Green, Esquire, was appointed to lay out said appropriation in manner prescribed by said law: *And whereas*, the said Elisha Green having died before the improvements contemplated by said act were completed, Thomas Jones, of Dauphin county, was appointed agent in his stead: *And whereas*, it appears from the settlement of the accounts of the said Thomas Jones by the late Auditor General, that the said Thomas Jones has laid out and expended in the said improvements the sum of eighty-nine dollars ninety-seven cents more than the sum appropriated for that purpose:

Preamble.

Therefore,

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the State Treasurer be and he is hereby authorised and required to pay to Thomas Jones, late agent for the improvement of the river Susquehanna, or order, the sum of eighty-nine dollars ninety-seven cents, out of any moneys in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, being the amount laid out and expended by him in the said improvement beyond the sum appropriated for that purpose.
