AN ACT

Authorising the citizens of the town of Madisonburg, in the county of Centre, to levy tax on real property for the purpose of keeping in repair the pipes conveying the water to said town.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the town of Madisonburg, in the county of Centre, shall be and the same is hereby erected into a borough, to be comprised within the limits and boundaries of the original plot or draft of said town, for the purpose of enabling the citizens aforesaid to lay a tax on all real property within the limits of said town, to keep in repair the pipes which supply the town with water and for no other purpose whatever.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That it shall be lawful for all taxable inhabitants, who have resided within the said borough three months previously to such election, to meet at such house or place as a majority of the citizens shall agree upon, on the second Tuesday of April in each and every year, and there elect by ballot, between the hours of three, P. M. and six

Madisonburg erected into a borough, within limits of original plot.

Election of assessors.

o'clock of the same day, three respectable citizens residing in said town, whose duty it shall be on petition to them for that purpose presented, signed by a majority of citizens of said town, in each and every year, to assess, levy and collect on all real property in said town, such amount of tax as may be necessary to keep in repair the pipes which supply the town with water: *Provided*, That no tax shall be laid by them in any one year to exceed one half cent in a dollar on the valuation of real property, taken from the last assessment, unless a majority of the taxable inhabitants of said borough, by writing under their hands, shall petition the said council to increase the rate per cent. but in no instance shall the tax in one year exceed the rate of one cent in every dollar of the adjusted valuation of the property aforesaid.

Their duties.

Limit of tax.

SECT. 3. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid*, That the said council shall have full power to issue their warrant with a duplicate, to some person, a citizen of said borough, requiring him to demand and receive of and from every person in said duplicate named, the sum wherewith such person stands charged, to be paid over by said collector to the treasurer, and if any person shall within thirty days from the time said tax is demanded of him, neglect or refuse to make payment, it shall be the duty of said collector to levy the said tax by distress and sale of the goods and chattels of the said delinquent, giving ten days public notice of such sale by written or printed advertisements.

Power to collect tax.

SECT. 4. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid*, That the said council shall at their first meeting in every year, appoint a treasurer, whose duty it shall be to receive the money levied and collected as aforesaid, and to pay out the same on orders drawn by the said council, signed by a majority of them.

Treasurer, and his duty.

SECT. 5. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid*, That the said council and treasurer before entering upon the duties of their respective offices, shall take and subscribe an oath or affirmation, before some justice of the peace, diligently, faithfully and impartially to perform the said duties enjoined on them by this act, without favor, affection, malice or ill-will, and file the same within three weeks thereafter in the prothonotary's office of said county.

Oaths of officers to be filed.

SECT. 6. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid*, That if it shall be found necessary to protect the fountain from which the water is brought, by building a house or other improvement, on the petition of a majority of the citizens of said town, the council shall have authority to

make use of said funds, collected as aforesaid, for such purpose.

AN ACT

Providing the means of employing and supporting the convicts in the eastern and western penitentiaries of this state.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,*

\$4000 appropriated to eastern penitentiary.

That the board of inspectors of the eastern penitentiary be and they hereby are authorised to draw from the state treasury, upon warrants drawn in the usual manner, any sum or sums of money which shall not exceed in the whole four thousand dollars, as a fund to provide the necessary tools, materials, fuel, food and clothing for the convicts confined in the said penitentiary, which warrants shall be paid out of any unappropriated moneys in the treasury.

Inspectors to charge certain portion of expenses to counties, and refund to treasury.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That it shall be the duty of the said board of inspectors to keep a just and true account of all moneys drawn from the treasury under the authority of this act, and of the particular purposes for which the same has been disbursed by them, and so much thereof as shall be applied to purposes for which the proper counties are legally chargeable, shall be returned by the said board of inspectors to the treasury of this commonwealth, as soon as the same shall have been received by them from the counties respectively.
