AN ACT

Providing the means of employing and supporting the convicts in the eastern and western penitentiaries of this state.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,*

\$4000 appropriated to eastern penitentiary.

That the board of inspectors of the eastern penitentiary be and they hereby are authorised to draw from the state treasury, upon warrants drawn in the usual manner, any sum or sums of money which shall not exceed in the whole four thousand dollars, as a fund to provide the necessary tools, materials, fuel, food and clothing for the convicts confined in the said penitentiary, which warrants shall be paid out of any unappropriated moneys in the treasury.

Inspectors to charge certain portion of expenses to counties, and refund to treasury.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That it shall be the duty of the said board of inspectors to keep a just and true account of all moneys drawn from the treasury under the authority of this act, and of the particular purposes for which the same has been disbursed by them, and so much thereof as shall be applied to purposes for which the proper counties are legally chargeable, shall be returned by the said board of inspectors to the treasury of this commonwealth, as soon as the same shall have been received by them from the counties respectively.

SECT. 3. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That so much of the seventh section of the act passed on the twenty-third day of April, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-nine, entitled "A supplement to an

act, entitled "An act to reform the penal laws of this commonwealth," as directs the appointment of a clerk for the eastern penitentiary, be and the same is hereby repealed, and that the duties of clerk shall be performed by one of the overseers until otherwise provided for by law.

SECT. 4. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the board of inspectors of the western penitentiary be and they are hereby authorised to draw from the state treasury, upon warrants drawn in the usual manner, any sum or sums of money which shall not exceed in the whole two thousand dollars, as a fund to be applied by the inspectors of the said prison, in making such alterations in the front building as they may deem necessary to accommodate the officers of the prison, which warrants shall be paid out of any unappropriated moneys in the treasury, and three thousand dollars to be appropriated to such alterations of the prison as will carry into effect solitary confinement of the prisoners, and their application to labor, and for the purpose of heating the cells agreeably to the last report of the commissioners of the western penitentiary.

\$2000 appropriated to western penitentiary to make alterations in front and \$3000 to carry into effect solitary confinement.

AN ACT

To establish a public ferry on the West Branch of the Susquehanna river, near the house of George Porter, in Clinton township, in Lycoming county.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That George Porter, his heirs and assigns, shall have the right, at his, her and their cost, to make a good and convenient landing on the north and south sides of the
