SECT. 4. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the board of inspectors of the western penitentiary be and they are hereby authorised to draw from the state treasury, upon warrants drawn in the usual manner, any sum or sums of money which shall not exceed in the whole two thousand dollars, as a fund to be applied by the inspectors of the said prison, in making such alterations in the front building as they may deem necessary to accommodate the officers of the prison, which warrants shall be paid out of any unappropriated moneys in the treasury, and three thousand dollars to be appropriated to such alterations of the prison as will carry into effect solitary confinement of the prisoners, and their application to labor, and for the purpose of heating the cells agreeably to the last report of the commissioners of the western penitentiary.

\$2000 appropriated to western penitentiary to make alterations in front and \$3000 to carry into effect solitary confinement.

AN ACT

To establish a public ferry on the West Branch of the Susquehanna river, near the house of George Porter, in Clinton township, in Lycoming county.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That George Porter, his heirs and assigns, shall have the right, at his, her and their cost, to make a good and convenient landing on the north and south sides of the

west branch of the river Susquehanna, and to use the said river between the said landings as a public ferry, on the estate of the said George Porter, situate on the great road leading across the said river, between Clinton township and Williamsport, in said county, above and near to the mouth of the Loyalsock creek.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the said George Porter, his heirs and assigns, shall keep the same landings and ferry in good order and repair, fit for the transportation and passing of men, horses, other animals and carriages of all kinds; and further, shall keep good and substantial boats and qualified ferry-men, who shall constantly as occasion may require, attend for the purpose of transporting travellers, cattle and carriages as aforesaid over the said river, with all reasonable diligence and attention.

SECT. 3. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the said George Porter, his heirs and assigns, for keeping up and maintaining the said landings and ferry as aforesaid, shall receive from persons passing over the said river at said ferry, such price or fees as is customarily paid at other ferries on said west branch of the river Susquehanna, subject to such rates and regulations as the court of quarter sessions of the county of Lycoming may order and direct: *Provided,* That nothing in this act contained shall be construed so as to vest in the said George Porter, his heirs and assigns, the right to receive or discharge any travellers, cattle or carriages as aforesaid, on land belonging to any other person or persons, without the consent of the owner or owners of such land, or to prevent any future legislature from resuming the privileges hereby granted.
