

sioners shall purchase the rights, property and estate of the said Joseph Kirkbride in said toll bridge, they shall hold, repair or rebuild the same under the usual regulations and existing laws for building bridges in the county of Philadelphia, and the same shall be free of all toll as other bridges erected by order of the said commissioners: *Provided*, That the said commissioners shall not purchase the said bridge, unless a majority of the said commissioners and of the judges of the court of quarter sessions in Philadelphia county, shall deem the purchase beneficial to the said county.

To hold, rebuild, &c. under existing laws.

Proviso. Purchase to be made by a majority, and approved by court.

SECT. 6. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid*, That the commissioners of the county of Northampton, with the approbation of the grand jury and judges of the court of quarter sessions of said county, or a majority of them, are hereby authorised to purchase a certain toll bridge that is built across the Smithfield creek, in the township of Smithfield, in said county, belonging to James Bell and Evan Thomas, for a sum not exceeding five hundred dollars, to be paid by said commissioners out of the county treasury, and from and after said purchase said bridge shall be free from toll, and be supported at the expense of the county, as all other county bridges are.

Comm'rs of Northampton with approbation of court may buy Bell and Thomas' bridge for \$500.

AN ACT

To authorise Peter Ihrie, junior, executor of George Ihrie, deceased, to sell and convey certain real estate.

WHEREAS, It has been represented to the legislature that it would be greatly for the advantage of the residuary legatees of George Ihrie, Esq. deceased, that a cer-

tain undivided half part of a lot of ground, bequeathed in and by the last will and testament of said deceased to said legatees, should be sold, and that because of the minority of some of the said legatees the same cannot, under the existing laws, be sold:

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That Peter Ihrle, junior, executor of the last will and testament of George Ihrle, late of the borough of Easton, in the county of Northampton, esquire, deceased, be and he hereby is authorised and empowered to sell and convey all the right, title and interest which the said George Ihrle, deceased, at the time of his death had and held in and to the one undivided half part of a certain lot of ground, with the appurtenances, situate in the district of Southwark, in the county of Philadelphia, and particularly described in a certain deed bearing date the twenty-fifth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and nineteen, executed by a certain John Dolby to the aforesaid George Ihrle, in his life time: *Provided,* The said Peter Ihrle, junior, before proceeding to make sale of the aforesaid real estate, shall give in the orphans' court of the county of Northampton, such security as said court may require, that he will well and faithfully pay over the proceeds of the sale or sales thereof, to such person or persons as may by law be entitled to receive the same, and that such sale shall not be valid until approved of by the court aforesaid.
