AN ACT

To authorise the sale of certain real estate held in trust for the First Independent Church of Christ, called Universalists, in the city of Philadelphia.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That Joseph Burden, Jonathan Johnson, Edwin T. Scott, Isaac Avery, David F. Condie, Thomas Amies and John W. Saunders, trustees of the church, or a majority of them, called the "First Independent Church of Christ, called Universalists, in the city of Philadelphia," and their successors in office, be and they are hereby authorised and empowered to sell and convey in fee simple, or on ground rent, either together or in parcels, as may be deemed most expedient, any portion or portions of the real estate held in trust for the said church: *Provided,* That before said sale shall be made, a meeting of the members of said church shall be called, previous notice of which shall be given from the pulpit of said church, three times successively, on the first day of the week, stating the object, time and place of holding it, and if at the said meeting a majority of the members of the said church then present shall decide in favor of selling said real estate, or any part thereof, then the said trustees or their successors shall sell and convey accordingly; a record of which consent and proceedings, including the names of the members voting for and against said sale, shall be kept by said church.
