peace, in and for the counties of Centre, Lycoming, Adams and Perry, it shall be the duty of such justice to examine such person or persons, on oath or affirmation, touching the place where and time when such fox or foxes, wild cat or wild cats, was or were taken and killed, and if the place or places of such taking and killing shall be found to be within the bounds of the proper county, it shall be the duty of such justice to give the person or persons a certificate of the facts to the commissioners of the county, together with the scalp as aforesaid; and the said commissioners, upon the receipt thereof, shall immediately have such scalp or scalps destroyed, and thereupon draw their warrant on the county treasurer of the proper county, for the scalp of a full grown fox fifty cents, and if for the scalp of a full grown wild cat, seventy-five cents, and for those that are not full grown twenty-five cents for each and every scalp so produced as aforesaid; and it shall be the duty of such treasurer and he is hereby directed to pay the amount of the said order.

AN ACT

To enable John Hassenplugh, administrator of David Neihard, deceased, to sell and convey the interest of minors in real estate.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That John Hassenplugh, administrator of David Neihard, be and he is hereby authorised and empowered to sell at public sale all the right, title and interest of the minor children of Daniel Neihard and David Neihard, sons of the said David Neihard, deceased, in and to a small lot of ground, situate in West Buffalo township, in the

county of Union, containing about one acre, and to convey the same in fee simple, by a deed to the purchaser, which shall have the same force and effect as if the said minors were of full age, and had sold and conveyed the same: *Provided*, That before the said John Hassenplugh shall make sale as aforesaid, he shall give bond in such sum and with such surety as the orphans' court of said county shall direct, conditioned for the faithful discharge of the duty enjoined upon him by this act, and proper application of the money arising from said sale: *And provided further*, That before said sale shall be valid, it shall be reported to and approved by said court.

AN ACT

To enable Christian Mosser, administrator of John Mosser, to sell and convey certain real estate.

WHEREAS, It is represented that Benjamin Mosser, late of Lancaster county, by his last will and testament, dated tenth of April, eighteen hundred and twenty, did devise a plantation situate in Manor township, county aforesaid, to his son Benjamin Mosser, provided he would accept the same on the conditions prescribed in said will, and in case of his refusal to accept the same, then the other children to have like privilege: *And whereas*, it is further represented that the said Benjamin and other children of the said Benjamin, have refused to accept the same on the conditions set forth in said will, but by an instrument of writing did agree to take the same together, as tenants in common: *And whereas*, John and Henry Mosser, two of the children of the said Benjamin are now dead, leaving heirs, some of whom are minors, and it being represented that their interest
