Sloane shall give bond to the commonwealth in such form, in such sum, and with such sufficient sureties, as the orphans' court of Luzerne county may direct, conditioned for the faithful execution of the trust hereby committed to him, and for the due and proper application of the proceeds of said sale, according to the order of the said court, and the true intent of the laws of this commonwealth: *And provided also*, Before the said sale shall be valid, it shall be approved of by the orphans' court aforesaid.

AN ACT

For the relief of sundry soldiers and widows of soldiers of the revolutionary war.

SECT. 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the State Treasurer be and he is hereby authorised and required to pay to Michael Leatherman of the county of Philadelphia, a soldier of the revolution, or to

his order, forty dollars immediately, as a gratuity and as a full compensation for his revolutionary services.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the State Treasurer be and he is hereby authorised and required to pay to Catharine Rodes and Hannah Hannon of the county of Philadelphia, widows of revolutionary soldiers, or to their respective orders, forty dollars each immediately, and an annuity of forty dollars each during life, payable half yearly, to commence on the first day of January, eighteen hundred and thirty.

SECT. 3. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the State Treasurer be and he is hereby authorised and required, to pay to Taurence Duffee of Tioga county, David Camp and John Hains of Berks county, soldiers of the revolutionary war, or to their respective orders, forty dollars each, immediately, and an annuity of forty dollars each, during life, payable half yearly, to commence on the first day of January, eighteen hundred and thirty.

SECT. 4. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the State Treasurer be and he is hereby authorised and required to pay to Mary Swain of the county of Philadelphia, widow of a revolutionary soldier, or to her order, forty dollars immediately, and an annuity of forty dollars during life, payable half yearly, to commence on the first day of January, eighteen hundred and thirty.

SECT. 5. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the State Treasurer be and he is hereby authorised and required, to pay to Simon Krewson, of the county of Philadelphia, or to his order, forty dollars immediately, as a gratuity, and as full compensation for his revolutionary services.

SECT. 6. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the State Treasurer be and he is hereby authorised and required, to pay to Eleanor Waters, widow of Jacob Waters, deceased, of Philadelphia, or to her order, forty dollars immediately, and an annuity of forty dollars, payable half yearly, to commence on the first day of January eighteen hundred and thirty.

SECT. 7. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the State Treasurer be and he is hereby authorised and required, to pay to John Rohrer, of the county of Lebanon, and Thomas Craven, of the county of Indiana, or to their respective orders, the sum of forty dollars each immediately as a gratuity, and an annuity of forty dollars each, during life, payable half yearly, to commence on the first day of January, eighteen hundred and thirty.

SECT. 8. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the State Treasurer be, and he is hereby authorised and required to pay to James Drenin, of Chester county, and to Andrew Gangawer, of Lehigh county, soldiers of the revolution, or to their respective orders, forty dollars each, immediately, as a gratuity, and as a compensation for their services in the revolutionary war. \$40 gratuity to J. Drenin and A. Gangawer.

SECT. 9. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the State Treasurer be and he is hereby authorised and required to pay to James Stevenson, of Trumbull county, in the state of Ohio, a soldier in the revolutionary war, or to his order, forty dollars as a gratuity, and as full compensation for his services in the revolution. Same to J. Stevenson.

SECT. 10. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the State Treasurer be and he is hereby authorised and required to pay to Evan Holt, of Knox county, in the state of Ohio, or to his order, two hundred dollars, as a full compensation for a tract of donation land to which he was entitled for his services as a soldier in the revolutionary war. \$200 for donation land to E. Holt.

SECT. 11. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the State Treasurer be and he is hereby authorised and required to pay to Arthur Eckles, of Beaver county, a soldier of the revolution, or to his order, forty dollars immediately, and an annuity of forty dollars during life, payable half yearly, to commence on the first day of January, eighteen hundred and thirty. \$40 annuity and gratuity to A. Eckles.

A FURTHER SUPPLEMENT

To the act entitled "An act to enable the Governor of this Commonwealth to incorporate a company for making an artificial road by the best and nearest route, from Waterford, in the county of Erie, through Meadville and Franklin, to the river Susquehanna,
