

SECT. 8. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the State Treasurer be, and he is hereby authorised and required to pay to James Drenin, of Chester county, and to Andrew Gangawer, of Lehigh county, soldiers of the revolution, or to their respective orders, forty dollars each, immediately, as a gratuity, and as a compensation for their services in the revolutionary war. §40 gratuity to J. Drenin and A. Gangawer.

SECT. 9. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the State Treasurer be and he is hereby authorised and required to pay to James Stevenson, of Trumbull county, in the state of Ohio, a soldier in the revolutionary war, or to his order, forty dollars as a gratuity, and as full compensation for his services in the revolution. Same to J. Stevenson.

SECT. 10. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the State Treasurer be and he is hereby authorised and required to pay to Evan Holt, of Knox county, in the state of Ohio, or to his order, two hundred dollars, as a full compensation for a tract of donation land to which he was entitled for his services as a soldier in the revolutionary war. §200 for donation land to E. Holt.

SECT. 11. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the State Treasurer be and he is hereby authorised and required to pay to Arthur Eckles, of Beaver county, a soldier of the revolution, or to his order, forty dollars immediately, and an annuity of forty dollars during life, payable half yearly, to commence on the first day of January, eighteen hundred and thirty. §40 annuity and gratuity to A. Eckles.

A FURTHER SUPPLEMENT

To the act entitled "An act to enable the Governor of this Commonwealth to incorporate a company for making an artificial road by the best and nearest route, from Waterford, in the county of Erie, through Meadville and Franklin, to the river Susquehanna,

at or near the mouth of Anderson's creek, in Clearfield county, and also to incorporate a company for making an artificial road from the town of Northumberland, in the county of Northumberland, by the best and nearest route, to the west branch of the Susquehanna, at or near the mouth of Anderson's creek, passing through Derrstown, Youngmanstown, Aaronsburg, Bellefonte and Milesburg, passed the twenty-ninth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and nineteen.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That from and after the passage of this act, the company authorised to make so much of a turnpike road as lies between the south end of the Lewisburg bridge and Youngmanstown, shall consist of a president, a treasurer, and four managers, and no more, the election of whom shall be conducted agreeably to the provisions of the act to which this is a further supplement.

AN ACT

To incorporate the Tuscarora and Cold Run tunnel and rail-road company.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That William Lawton, Joseph Lyon, William Audenried, Charles Troxall, and Edwin Swift, of Schuylkill county, or any two of them, be and they are hereby appointed commissioners to do and perform the several things hereinafter mentioned, that is to say, they shall on or before the first day of
