A FURTHER SUPPLEMENT

To the act entitled "An act to provide for the education of children at the public expense, within the city and county of Philadelphia," passed the third day of March, eighteen hundred and eighteen.

WHEREAS, It is found that by reason of the increased duties incumbent on the directors of public schools for the second section of the first school district of the state of Pennsylvania, under the provisions of the act of March third, eighteen hundred and eighteen, the board of directors in and for the said section is not sufficiently large for the regular performance thereof:

Preamble.

Therefore,

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,*

That the commissioners of the incorporated part of the Northern Liberties, and the commissioners of the district of Kensington, shall each annually elect twelve qualified taxable inhabitants residing within the bounds of the second section of the first school district, as directors of the public schools in and for the second section of the first school district of the state of Pennsylvania, in the same manner and form, at the same time, and in all respects subject to the same provisions as those now or heretofore elected by the said commissioners, by virtue of the second section of the act entitled "An act to provide for the education of children at the public expense, within the city and county of Philadelphia," passed March third, eighteen hundred and eighteen, and also the sixth section of a supplement to an act, entitled "An act to incorporate the Kensington district in the Northern Liberties," passed April second, eighteen hundred and twenty-two: *Provided*, That the present number of comptrollers of the public schools shall neither be increased nor diminished by this act.

Commissioners N. Liberties and Kensington each to elect 12 directors annually.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,*

That it shall be lawful for the commissioners aforesaid, at any time before the first day of May next, to proceed to complete the number of directors for the second section of the first school district, as provided for in the first section of this act, by each electing six directors, in addition to the twelve already elected under the existing laws, which twelve directors shall be considered in all respects subject to the same provisions as other directors, and shall hold their office for the same period

Proviso. Number of comptrollers not changed.

Comm'rs to elect additional directors before 1st May, &c.

as if they had been elected at the same time with the twelve directors chosen in the month of January, eighteen hundred and thirty.

Parts of

SECT. 3. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That such part or parts of the second section of the said act of third March, eighteen hundred and eighteen, and of the sixth section of the supplement to an act entitled "An act to incorporate the Kensington district in the Northern Liberties," passed April second eighteen hundred and twenty-two, as are hereby altered or supplied, be and the same are hereby repealed.

AN ACT

Authorising the laying out of certain state roads in Butler, Armstrong and Venango counties.

Commissioners named to lay out road from Butler to Graham's ferry.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That Michael M'Cullough, of Armstrong; and George W. Barker and Matthew Smith, of Butler county, be and they are hereby appointed commissioners to view, lay out and mark a state road from the borough of Butler, in Butler county, through Fairview and Lawrenceburg, to Thomas Graham's ferry, on the Allegheny river.

From Graham's ferry to Franklin.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That Thomas Graham, of Armstrong county, Joseph Porterfield and David Smith, of Venango county, be and they are hereby appointed commissioners to view, lay out and mark a state road from Thomas Graham's ferry, on the Allegheny river, by McCaslin's ferry and Porterfield's mills, to Franklin.
