

SECT. 10. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That if the said prothonotaries, registers and recorders shall neglect or refuse to settle and pay over the full amount to the State Treasurer at the times hereinbefore directed, the Auditor General shall direct the proper attorney for the commonwealth in the respective county, to sue for and recover the same, without any stay of execution, and without allowing to such prothonotary, register or recorder any compensation or commissions.

A FURTHER SUPPLEMENT

To the act entitled "An act for the regulation of the militia of this commonwealth."

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the battalion parades and trainings within the first brigade of the ninth division, shall commence on the third Monday of May in every year, and shall continue in such order as the brigade inspector shall direct, on every day of the week, (except Sunday) until all the battalions of the brigade shall have paraded, any thing in any former law to the contrary notwithstanding.

Battalion parades in 1st brigade, 9th division, to commence 3d Monday in May.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the fifth company attached to the second battalion, fifty-fourth regiment, first brigade, ninth division, Pennsylvania militia, is hereby exempt from mustering with said battalion on days of battalion training, unless otherwise ordered by the brigadier general of said brigade, but they shall muster on said day within the bounds of the company.

5th company 54th reg. 1st brig. 9th div. exempted from parading with batt. unless specially ordered.

SECT. 3. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That so much of the thirty-seventh section of the act to

which this is a supplement, as prescribes that volunteer companies not belonging to any regiment or battalion of volunteers, shall be attached to and train with the militia on days of regimental or battalion training, be and the same is hereby repealed, so far as respects the National Greys, the Windsor Guards, the Peach Bottom Blues and the Citizen Guards of the county of York, and the Washington Greys of the city of Lancaster.

SECT. 4. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the enrolled militia attached to the first and second battalions of the sixty-second regiment, second brigade, tenth division Pennsylvania militia, residing within the following bounds, shall hereafter compose a separate battalion, to be called the third battalion of the aforesaid regiment, any thing in any former law to the contrary notwithstanding, that is to say, commencing at Jack's Narrows, thence to the summit of Jack's mountain, running thence in a direct line with said mountain, to the line dividing Huntingdon and Bedford counties, thence along said line to the summit of Tussy mountain, thence along the summit of said mountain, opposite to the widow Peichtle's, thence in a line to the summit of Terrace mountain, so as to include the dwelling house of the widow Peichtle and the dwelling house of William Dean, at Raystown branch, thence to the head of little Trough creek and thence to the place of beginning, including all the inhabitants of Hare's valley: *Provided,* That if at any time hereafter it shall be found necessary to attach said battalion to any other battalion, so as to form a new regiment, it shall be done in the manner prescribed by the sixth section of the act to which this is a supplement, passed the second April, eighteen hundred and twenty-two: *And provided further,* That the enrolled militia of the third battalion aforesaid, shall be entitled to elect one major, one adjutant, and one quarter master for said battalion, the first election to be held at such time as may be fixed upon by the proper brigade inspector.
