AN ACT

Regulating election districts.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the electors of the township of Chest, in the county of Clearfield, shall hereafter hold their general election at the house of William Mahaffy, in said township.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the electors of the eleventh election district in the county of Union, shall hereafter hold their general elections at the house now occupied by Henry Weirich, in the town of Centreville.

SECT. 3. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the electors of the township of Vernon, in Crawford county, shall hereafter hold their general election at the house of Joseph Affantrenger, in said township.

SECT. 4. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the electors of the township of Conneaut, in Crawford county, shall hereafter hold their general election at the town-house in said township.

- Tioga. SECT. 19. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the electors residing in the sixth election district in the county of Tioga, shall hereafter hold their general election at the house now in possession of William Ludington, in the township of Sullivan.
- Bucks. SECT. 20. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the electors residing in the township of New Britain, in the county of Bucks, shall hereafter hold their general election at the house of Isaac W. James, in the township aforesaid.
- Bedford. SECT. 21. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That so much of an act passed the twenty-third day of April, eighteen hundred and twenty-nine, changing the place of holding the general election in the township of Londonderry, in the county of Bedford, be and the same is hereby repealed.
- Mercer. SECT. 22. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the township of Delaware, in the county of Mercer, shall be and the same is hereby erected into a separate election district, and the electors thereof shall hold their general election at the public house now occupied by Robert M'Kean, in said township.
- M'Kean. SECT. 23. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the township of Corydon, in the county of M'Kean, be erected into a separate election district, and that the electors of said township shall hereafter hold the general election at the house now or lately of Samuel Morrison, in said township.

SECT. 24. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the electors of the township of Union, in the county of Schuylkill shall hereafter hold the general election at the house of John Eisenhauer in said township. Schuylkill.

SECT. 25. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the township of Rush, in the county of Schuylkill, be and the same is hereby erected into a separate election district, and that the electors of the same hold their general election at the house of John Braus, in said township. SECT. 26. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the township of Schuylkill, in the county of Schuylkill, except that part which is now annexed to the Pottsville election district, be and the same is hereby erected into a separate election district, and that the electors of the same hold their general elections at the house of Frederick Bensinger, innkeeper, in said township. SECT. 27. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the township of Barree, in the county of Huntingdon, shall be a separate election district, and the electors thereof shall hold their general election at the house of John Harper, in the town of Salsbury, in said township. SECT. 28. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That all that part of Woodbury township, Huntingdon county, lying south of a line to commence at the line of said township on the summit of Tussy's mountain, thence to run westwardly, so as to include the house of Joseph Everhart, and south of the houses of Aaron Burns, John Ditch, and Peter Sorrick, so as to include the powder mill on Piney creek, and thence to the line of said township, on the summit of Canoe mountain, shall be a separate election district, and the electors thereof shall hold their general election at the house of Casper Delling, junior, and that the assessors for the said township shall be chosen for the next year at the place aforesaid, and after that, alternately, once in Williamsburg, and at the place aforesaid. SECT. 29. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That Limestone and Tionista townships, in Warren county, are hereby erected into a separate election district, and the electors thereof shall hereafter hold their general elections at the house now occupied by Henry M'Gee, in Limestone township. Erie. **SECT. 34.** *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the township of Leboeuff, in the county of Erie, is hereby erected into a separate election district, and the electors of said township shall hereafter hold their general election at the house now occupied by Richard Allen in said township.

Erie. **SECT. 35.** *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the electors of the township of Waterford, in the county of Erie, shall hereafter hold their general elections at the house now occupied by Thomas King, in the town of Waterford.

Washington. **SECT. 36.** *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the electors of Fallowfield township, in the county of Washington, shall hereafter hold their general elections at the house now occupied by Abraham Frye, in said township.

Washington. **SECT. 37.** *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the township of East Finley, in the county of Washington, is hereby erected into a separate election district, and the electors of said township shall hereafter hold their general elections at the house now occupied by Henry Eulow, senior, in said township.

Washington. **SECT. 38.** *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the township of West Findley, in the county of Washington, is hereby erected into a separate election district, and the electors of said township shall hereafter hold their general elections at the house now occupied by John Sutherland, in said township.

SECT. 39. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the electors of that part of Pitt township, who have heretofore voted in the east ward of the city of

Pittsburg, residing within the following boundaries, shall hold their annual elections at the house now occupied by Joshua Kay, and owned by John Anderson, in said township, and known as the "Fountain Inn," that is to say: Beginning on the Monongahela river, at a point where the eastern line of the city of Pittsburg strikes the same, thence northwardly by the said city line to the boundary of the borough of the Northern Liberties, thence along the same to the south eastern corner thereof, being the south eastern corner of Boyle Irwin's land, thence to the south western corner of Springfield farm, belonging to O'Hara's heirs, thence by the boundary of said farm, including the same, to the Two Mile run, thence up said run by Roup's mill, to Henry Fulton's farm house, thence in a straight line to William Knox's farm house, on the Four Mile run, including the two last mentioned places, thence down the said Four Mile run to the Monongahela river, and thence down the Monongahela to the place of beginning, and the qualified voters of said district are hereby authorised to elect a constable for said district, on the fifteenth of May next, to serve until the township election next ensuing, and the said constable may be elected at the township elections in each year thereafter, to serve for the term of one year, and the citizens residents of that part of Pitt township, Allegheny county, lying between the borough of the Northern Liberties of Pittsburg, the district above erected, the Two Mile run, and the Allegheny river, including Springfield farm, and those resident upon Wainwright's island, are hereby attached to the election district of the Northern Liberties of Pittsburg; and all the residue of Pitt township shall vote at the present place of holding the general elections for said township.

SECT. 40. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the electors of that part of the lower district of St. Clair township, in the county of Allegheny, not included in the borough of Birmingham, shall hereafter hold their general elections at the house now occupied by John Obey, in the said township.

SECT. 41. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That all the following described parts of the townships of Juniata, Saville, Tyrone, and Wheatfield, in the county of Perry, included in the following boundaries, shall hereafter form a separate election district, to wit: beginning at the mouth of Little Buffaloe creek, in Juniata township, thence up said creek to the house of John Smith, in Saville township, including said house, thence by a straight line to the house of Abraham Kistler, in Tyrone township, including said house, thence

by a straight line to Jacob Shatto's saw mill, in said township, thence down the summit of the Iron ridge to the house of John Greer, in Wheatfield township, including said house, thence along the summit of Dick's Hill to Johnston's saw mill, in last said township, thence by a straight line to Dick's Gap, in Juniata township, thence along the summit of the Mahonoy Hill, to the house of Alexander Watson, on the bank of the Juniata river, including said house, thence up said river to the place of beginning, and the qualified electors thereof shall hold their general elections at the court house in Bloomfield.

SECT. 42. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That all that part of French creek township, in Venango county, lying east of the Allegheny river, and known by the name of Cranberry township shall be a separate election district, as soon as the court of quarter sessions of Venango county, shall organise the said township of Cranberry, and the said court in organising the said township of Cranberry shall fix the place where the electors thereof shall hold their general election.

SECT. 43. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That from and after the passing of this act, the unincorporated part of Penn township, in the county of Philadelphia, shall be a separate election district, and the electors thereof shall hold their general elections at the Lamb Tavern, now occupied by John Hardy, situate on the continuation of Canal street, in said township.

SECT. 44. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That from and after the passage of this act, the name and style of the borough of Greensburg in the county of Beaver, be and the same is hereby changed to the name and style of the borough of Darlington, and that so much of Little Beaver township, in the county of Beaver, as is included in the following bounds, to wit: Beginning at the line of Big Beaver township, and including the house of John Sharp, thence running westwardly, including the houses of Francis Chatley, Henry Veon, and Joseph Dilworth, to the state line, continuing down the state line to South Beaver township, thence up the South Beaver line to Big Beaver township, thence along said township to the place of beginning, be and the same is hereby erected into a separate election district, and the inhabitants shall hold their elections at the academy in the town of Darlington.

SECT. 45. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the electors of the township of Roxborough, in the county of Philadelphia, shall on the third

Friday in May next, and at the same place where they meet to choose supervisors for the said township, elect two reputable citizens, residing in the township aforesaid, and return the names of the persons so elected to the next general court of quarter sessions to be held for the county of Philadelphia, and the said court shall appoint one of them to be constable for the said township, to reside in the town of Manyunk, to continue in office until an election be held, and proceedings had thereon, as directed by the next section of this act.

SECT. 46. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the electors of the said township of Roxborough, in the county of Philadelphia, shall, on the same day, and at the same place where they meet to choose supervisors, annually hereafter elect four reputable citizens, residing in the township aforesaid, and return the names of the persons so elected, to the next general court of quarter sessions to be held for the county of Philadelphia, and the said court shall appoint two of them constables for the said township, one of whom shall reside in the said town of Manyunk.

SECT. 47. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the electors of Versailles township, in Allegheny county, shall hold their general elections at the house formerly occupied by James Alexander, in the town of M'Keesport, in said township.

AN ACT

Relative to the Coshecton and Great Bend turnpike road.

If road is neglected, judge of court of com. pleas to appoint 3 examiners, and make inquiry.

SECT. 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That if the president, managers and company of the Coshecton turnpike road shall neglect to keep the said road in good and perfect order and repair, for the space of fifteen days, and information thereof shall be given to any judge of the court of common pleas of the proper county, such judge shall issue a precept to be directed to any constable, commanding him to summon three judicious freeholders, to meet at a certain time in the said precept to be mentioned, at the place in the said road which is complained of, of which meeting four days notice shall be given to the keeper of the gate or turnpike nearest thereto, and the said judge shall at such time and place, by the oaths or affirmations of the said freeholders, inquire whether the said road or any part
