SECT. 3. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That from and after the period for which the president and managers were elected, the number of managers in the Philadelphia and Great Bend turnpike road company shall be five, the president included, to be elected as heretofore and to possess the same powers, a majority of whom shall be a quorum to do business.

AN ACT

For the relief of Peter Aurand, late deputy marshal of Berks and Schuylkill counties, and to authorise the Auditor General to settle the accounts of Nathaniel Brooke, John Mitchell and Francis W. Rawle.

Preamble.

WHEREAS, Peter Aurand, of the borough of Reading, was deputy marshal for Berks and Schuylkill counties, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventeen, and during his term of office received from different courts martial suits of persons who had been fined for non-performance of militia duty, during the late war with Great Britain; that in pursuance of his duty, he was obliged to travel through every part of the said counties, to serve notices and other process on persons many of whom proved insolvent, and from whom no part of the fines imposed could be obtained, amounting in all to six hundred and ninety-eight dollars and eighty-four cents: *And whereas*, the said Peter Aurand collected fines to the amount of two thousand seven hundred and twenty-two dollars, which by the direction of the Governor of this commonwealth, was ordered to be repaid to the several persons from whom it was collected, and for which he received no compensation for collecting and repaying: *And whereas*, on the first day of November, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty-five, the account of said Peter Aurand was settled under the provisions of the act entitled

"An act to amend and consolidate the several acts relating to the settlement of the public accounts, and the payment of the public monies, and for other purposes," passed the thirtieth day of March, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eleven, and the acts supplementary thereto, by which account there appears due to the commonwealth the sum of six thousand three hundred and forty-six dollars and seventy-eight and a half cents: *And whereas*, the commonwealth of Pennsylvania have recovered judgment against the said Peter Aurand, for the whole amount of said sum of six thousand three hundred and forty-six dollars and seventy-eight and a half cents, together with interest thereon from the first day of February, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty-six:

Therefore,

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That Peter Aurand, of Berks county, be and he is hereby allowed a credit for the sum of eight hundred dollars, on the judgment obtained against him by the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in the circuit court of Berks county, and the officer or other person who may be charged with the collection of the moneys due on said judgment, is hereby directed to allow the said Peter Aurand a credit on said judgment for said sum: *Provided however*, That the lien of the commonwealth against all the real estate of Peter Aurand and his securities, throughout the commonwealth, from the date of the settlement of his account by virtue of the twelfth section of the act entitled "An act to amend and consolidate the several acts relating to the settlement of the public accounts, and the payment of the public moneys, and for other purposes," passed the thirtieth day of March, A. D. one thousand eight hundred and eleven, shall not be destroyed or in any wise impaired, so far as respects the residue of the amount due from the said Peter Aurand to the commonwealth, by any thing in this act contained.

P. Aurand allowed a credit on judgment of comm'th of \$800.

Proviso.

Not to affect lien on estate or sureties, for balance of judgment.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid*, That the Auditor General is hereby authorised to audit and adjust the accounts of Nathaniel Brooke, late inspector of the first brigade, third division, Pennsylvania militia, for his services and expenses incurred in the prosecution of four suits, in the court of common pleas of Chester county, for the recovery of militia fines against certain delinquents, as also for his services and expenses incurred in a prosecution of these suits before the supreme court of the eastern district, and these ac-

counts, when audited and adjusted, are hereby authoris-
ed to be paid out of any moneys in the treasury not
otherwise appropriated: *Provided*, The same shall not
exceed five hundred dollars.

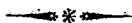
SECT. 3. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid;*
That the Auditor General be and he is hereby authorised
to settle and adjust the accounts of John Mitchell and
Francis W. Rawle, for stage fare and expenses incurred
in the examination of the works of the Delaware and
Hudson canal company, made in pursuance of a resolu-
tion of the present legislature, and the State Treasurer
is hereby authorised to pay the said accounts when so
adjusted, out of any moneys in the treasury not other-
wise appropriated.

A FURTHER SUPPLEMENT

To an act entitled "An act to declare and regulate escheats."

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Repre-
sentatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania in general as-
sembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,*
That in all cases of proceedings before and after the pass-
ing of this act, in pursuance of the acts to which this act is
supplementary, the prothonotary of the county in whose
office the award of the jury of inquest has been hereto-
fore or may be hereafter filed, shall issue such writs of
execution to the sheriff or coroner, as the case may be,
and such proceedings shall be had in the name of the
commonwealth, against the person or persons in whose
hands or possession any escheated pecuniary personal
estate, or any part thereof, is found by such award, for
the recovery of the amount so found in their hands or
possession, as is used for the recovery of judgment en-
tered against the defendants therein, in their individual
