Relative to payment of collectors and lock keepers on the Pennsylvania canal.

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, That the commissioners of the internal improvement fund be and they are hereby directed to pay the salaries of the collectors of toll and lock-keepers, on the Pennsylvania canal, out of the monies arising

from tolls collected on said canal, until otherwise directed by law: *Provided*, That no collector of toll or lock-keeper shall be entitled to such salary except from the time the said canal was in public use.

RESOLUTION.

Relative to authorising the payment of a certain sum of money now in the treasury of the commissioners of the internal improvement fund.

Resolved, By the Senate and House of Representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, That four hundred and eighty thousand dollars of the permanent loan authorised by the act of the twenty-second of April; one thousand eight hundred and twenty-nine, which is now in the treasury of the commissioners of the internal improvement fund, be applied by the said commissioners to the payment of the demand upon that fund, and that the residue of the temporary loans which have been extended for a further period of time by the consent of the lenders, under the resolution of the House of Representatives of the seventh November, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-nine, be repaid by the commissioners of the internal improvement fund, out of the permanent loan authorised by the act of the seventh December, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-nine, entitled "An act authorising loans from certain banks."
