Relative to the tariff of eighteen hundred and twenty-eight.

RESOLUTION

Relative to certain obstructions in the rivers Lackawaxen and Delaware, erected by the Hudson and Delaware canal and rail-road company.

Engineers appointed to examine.

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, That John Wilson, Francis W. Rawle and John Mitchell, esquires, be and they are hereby appointed engineers, who or any two of them are required to make full examination, and to declare in their report to this legislature, within twenty-five days after the adoption of this resolution, whether the channel of the river Lackawaxen, or the channel of the river Delaware, or either of them, is or are by any of the works or improvements of Maurice Wurtz, or by any of the works

or improvements of the president, managers and company of the Delaware and Hudson canal company, or the agents of the said company, rendered less safe and convenient for navigation than they were before the said works and improvements were commenced.

Resolved by the authority aforesaid, That the said engineers or any one of them, be required to give reasonable notice, (by letters placed in the post office,) to the president and also to the agent of the said company, of the time when they will proceed to the examination aforesaid, and to examine, ascertain and report to the legislature, whether the said company have complied with the provisions of the third section of the act entitled "A supplement to the act entitled An act to improve the navigation of the river Lackawaxen," passed the first day of April, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-five, which made it the duty of the said company, at each and every place where these works may be connected with the river Delaware, to erect a lock or locks and keep lock tenders, so as to provide for the ascent and descent of boats and craft as aforesaid, and without delay.

RESOLUTION

Relative to the Delaware and Hudson canal company.

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, That the president, managers and company of the Delaware and Hudson canal company, be and they are hereby excused and exonerated from building the river lock in the dam across the river Delaware, for the present, and until they shall be required to do the same by an act or resolution of the legislature of Pennsylvania: *Provided,* That the said company shall by their proper officer or officers, within six months from this time, submit to the Governor of the state of Pennsylvania, their consent that the state of Pennsylvania may at
