RESOLUTION

Relative to the Philadelphia and Columbia Rail-Road.

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, That the Canal Commissioners be, and they are hereby instructed to take immediate measures to have a survey made by an experienced engineer, who has not heretofore been employed on the Philadelphia and Columbia rail-road, of the ground between the Big and Little Conestoga bridges, on the Philadelphia and Columbia rail-road, for the purpose of ascertaining the practicability of changing the present location of said rail road, that it may pass through the city of Lancaster, so as to cross North Queen street, as far within the business part of said city as the graduation will admit, and make report thereof to this legislature, together with an estimate of the cost and amount of damages, which such change would incur, and the time required to
