RESOLUTION

Relative to soldiers of the revolutionary war.

Resolved, by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, That the legislature fully and freely accord with, and respond to the resolutions adopted by the legislatures of the states of Delaware and Indiana, relative to placing on the United States pension list such of the officers and soldiers of the revolutionary war, both regulars and militia, or their widows, as do not come within the present rules and requisitions of the acts of Congress, and that it be respectfully and earnestly recommended to our Senators and Representatives in Congress, to use their exertions to procure such a modification of the pension laws as will comport with the spirit and intention of this resolution.

moreland county, and if the facts stated in his memorial presented to the House of Representatives, on the twenty-eighth of February, eighteen hundred and thirty-two, be proved to the satisfaction of the said Canal Commissioners, that they shall allow him such compensation as they may think just, and if the said Murry be dissatisfied with the decision of the Canal Commissioners, he shall have the right of appeal to the board of appraisers, as in cases now provided for by law, and if the said facts be proved to the satisfaction of the board of appraisers, they shall allow the said Murry such compensation as they may think just, and whatever sum of money may be adjudged to the said Murry, either by the Canal Commissioners, or by the board of appraisers shall be paid out of the same fund, and in the same manner as in cases of damages sustained by reason of the construction of the Pennsylvania canal, now provided for by law: *Provided nevertheless*, That the advantages derived by the said James Murry, from the said Pennsylvania canal be taken into consideration in the assessment of the said damages.

RESOLUTION

Relative to Joseph M'Masters.

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, That the State Treasurer be, and he is hereby directed to pay Joseph M'Masters, late Deputy Marshal of Allegheny county, such monies as may appear to be due him by the settlement of his accounts with the Auditor General, on the thirty-first October, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-six, and on the eleventh of January, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-two, the aforesaid monies to be paid out of
