moreland county, and if the facts stated in his memorial presented to the House of Representatives, on the twenty-eighth of February, eighteen hundred and thirty-two, be proved to the satisfaction of the said Canal Commissioners, that they shall allow him such compensation as they may think just, and if the said Murry be dissatisfied with the decision of the Canal Commissioners, he shall have the right of appeal to the board of appraisers, as in cases now provided for by law, and if the said facts be proved to the satisfaction of the board of appraisers, they shall allow the said Murry such compensation as they may think just, and whatever sum of money may be adjudged to the said Murry, either by the Canal Commissioners, or by the board of appraisers shall be paid out of the same fund, and in the same manner as in cases of damages sustained by reason of the construction of the Pennsylvania canal, now provided for by law: *Provided nevertheless*, That the advantages derived by the said James Murry, from the said Pennsylvania canal be taken into consideration in the assessment of the said damages.

the fund arising from fines of delinquent militia men, for non-performance of militia duty during the late war.

RESOLUTION

Relative to the schute in Snyder's mill dam, on Penn's creek.

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, That the Canal Commissioners be, and they are hereby authorized and required to repair or re-build the schute in the dam across Penn's creek, at Snyder's mill, with the least possible delay, and make such other improvements to secure the safe passage of arks and rafts, and that the expense thereof be defrayed out of any monies in the internal improvement fund, not otherwise appropriated: *Provided,* The same does not exceed the sum of seven hundred dollars.
