Resolved, by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, That the members and officers of the legislature shall not be entitled to receive daily pay during the adjournment, from the twelfth of April next to the twenty-ninth of May next, and that the members be entitled to receive the usual mileage for attending and returning from the adjourned session, which is to commence on the twenty-ninth of May next.

RESOLUTION

To pay the reward to Stewart and Hays, for apprehending a fugitive from justice.

Resolved, by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, That the Governor be and he is hereby authorized to draw his warrant in favor of John Stewart and Simeon Hays, of the city of Baltimore, upon the State Treasurer, for the sum of two hundred dollars, the amount of the reward offered for the apprehension of a certain fugitive, charged with killing a certain John Lynch, from justice by the proclamation of the Governor, dated the third of June, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-one: *Provided,* That the Governor be satisfied that the said Stewart and Hays come within the terms of his proclamation in all other respects,
