### RESOLUTION

For the relief of Isaac Griffith, late Deputy Marshal of the Eastern district of Pennsylvania.

WHEREAS, a judgment was lately obtained in the court of Common Pleas, of Bucks county, at the suit of the Commonwealth against Isaac Griffith, late Deputy Marshal for the Eastern District of Pennsylvania, for certain fines which had been collected from delinquents in that county, for non-performance of militia duty during the late war with Great Britain: And, whereas, in the settlement of the accounts of the said Deputy Marshal, he did not receive a credit for certain services rendered under his appointment, for which it seems reasonable he should be allowed, amounting to a sum equal to the judgment so obtained: Therefore,

*Resolved, by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met,* That the said Isaac Griffith, late Deputy Marshal of the Eastern District of Pennsylvania, be, and he is hereby released and discharged from the payment of the said judgment, so entered and remaining unsatisfied against him in the suit aforesaid, and that the lands and goods of the said Isaac Griffith, shall, from and after the adoption of this resolution, be exonerated from any execution or executions which has been, or may be issued for the recovery of the said judgment: *Provided,* That nothing in this resolution shall prevent or interfere with the recovery from the said Isaac Griffith, of all the costs, charges and expenses which may have accrued in the prosecution of said suit, including

as well the moneys already advanced as any expenses which may yet be due, and payable by the Commonwealth by reason of the proceedings in the case, the amount of which shall be certified by the Auditor General, and make a part of the bill of costs against the defendant, as fully as if the whole amount of the judgment was paid into the treasury of the state: *And provided also*, That the proceedings shall not be stayed until the said costs and charges shall be fully paid and satisfied.

### RESOLUTION

Relative to the Robbstown Bridge.

1st sect of act  
of 16th  
March, 1832,  
repealed.

*Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met*; That the first section of the act entitled "An act relative to the Robbstown bridge company, and the Phillipsburg and Juniata rail road company," passed the sixteenth day of March, Anno Domini, eighteen hundred and thirty-two, be, and the same is hereby repealed, and that the said Robbstown bridge company are hereby authorized to demand and receive from all persons who may pass or carry their property over said bridge, when it shall have been completed, toll at the same rates as are prescribed by the act entitled, "An act to authorize the Governor to incorporate a company to erect a bridge over the Monongahela river at Williamsport," passed the sixteenth day of March, A. D. eighteen hundred and thirty-two.
