RESOLUTION

Relative to the Commissioners for revising the code of Pennsylvania.

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, That the term allowed by the fourth resolution adopted on the twenty-third of March, one thousand eight hundred and thirty, to the commissioners for revising the code, &c. be extended to two years from and after the twenty-third day of March, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-two. ^{Time allowed for performance of duties extended.}

And be it further resolved, That the said commissioners be authorized to make report to the Legislature from time to time within that period of such parts or branches of the law as they shall have prepared for the Legislature. ^{Intermediate reports authorized.}

And be it further resolved, That the said commissioners shall during the said period apply themselves assiduously to the object of their appointment, and shall be allowed the annual sum of two thousand dollars each, which shall be in full of compensation for their services, and for all expenses of whatever nature or kind, incurred by the said commissioners in the performance of their duties, which sum shall be paid quarterly, by warrants drawn on the treasury in the usual manner.

And be it further resolved, That the State Treasurer be and he is hereby authorized and directed to pay, in the usual manner, to the orders of William Rawle, Thomas I. Wharton and Joel Jones, Esquires, commissioners appointed by the Governor in pursuance of the said resolutions of the twenty-third day of March, one thousand eight hundred and thirty, the sum of one thousand dollars each, in full of all compensation for services and expenses in the performance of their duties heretofore, and up to the twenty-third day of March, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-two.

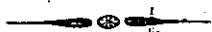

RESOLUTION

Relative to the record of the appraisers of damages.

Preamble.

WHEREAS, by the sixth section of the act of sixth of April, one thousand eight hundred and thirty, it is made the duty of the Governor to appoint three persons as a board of appraisers to whom all appeals are to be made by persons who may be dissatisfied with the amount of damages offered by the board of Canal Commissioners, and it is made the duty of the said board of appraisers justly and equitably to assess the damages sustained by such person in the manner
