

And be it further resolved, That the said commissioners shall during the said period apply themselves assiduously to the object of their appointment, and shall be allowed the annual sum of two thousand dollars each, which shall be in full of compensation for their services, and for all expenses of whatever nature or kind, incurred by the said commissioners in the performance of their duties, which sum shall be paid quarterly, by warrants drawn on the treasury in the usual manner.

And be it further resolved, That the State Treasurer be and he is hereby authorized and directed to pay, in the usual manner, to the orders of William Rawle, Thomas I. Wharton and Joel Jones, Esquires, commissioners appointed by the Governor in pursuance of the said resolutions of the twenty-third day of March, one thousand eight hundred and thirty, the sum of one thousand dollars each, in full of all compensation for services and expenses in the performance of their duties heretofore, and up to the twenty-third day of March, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-two.

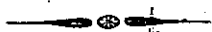

RESOLUTION

Relative to the record of the appraisers of damages.

Preamble.

WHEREAS, by the sixth section of the act of sixth of April, one thousand eight hundred and thirty, it is made the duty of the Governor to appoint three persons as a board of appraisers to whom all appeals are to be made by persons who may be dissatisfied with the amount of damages offered by the board of Canal Commissioners, and it is made the duty of the said board of appraisers justly and equitably to assess the damages sustained by such person in the manner

prescribed by existing laws, whose determination thereon shall be final, and they shall make out a record of their proceedings, a copy of which shall be delivered to the board of Canal Commissioners, to be by them carried into effect according to law: *And whereas*, The said appraisers, did, in the latter part of September last, view and appraise the damages sustained along the line of the Delaware division of the Pennsylvania canal, and before the said record and copy of the proceedings were made out, one of the appraisers died, by which it appears the intention of the law cannot be carried into effect: Therefore,

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, That the Canal Commissioners be and they are hereby authorized and required to pay out of the money appropriated for the payment of damages in the second section of the act relative to canals and rail-roads, passed the thirtieth March, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-two, agreeably to the terms and restrictions of said act, and as if the said deceased appraiser was still living, and had signed to the several persons in whose favor damages have been awarded upon the Delaware division of the Pennsylvania canal, by the appraisers of damages under the act of the sixth April, Anno Domini, eighteen hundred and thirty, and that the agreement or record that has been signed by any two of the appraisers under said act shall be a sufficient warrant and authority to the canal commissioners for the payment of the amount so awarded upon the Delaware division of the Pennsylvania Canal.
