

wealth to meet a like number (if the same shall be appointed on the part of the state of New Jersey,) to view the dam complained of as well as any obstructions authorized by either state, or the citizens thereof, and ascertain the facts and make report thereon to the Governors of their respective states, to be by them submitted to the Legislatures thereof.

Resolved by the authority aforesaid, That the Commissioners on the part of this commonwealth be authorized and required to employ a competent and disinterested engineer to examine the Delaware division of the Pennsylvania canal, at and near Well's Falls in the river Delaware, and from that place to the next lock below, for the purpose of ascertaining the most practicable and economical manner of permanently supplying the said canal with water, and make such specifications and estimates of costs as may be necessary for that purpose, all which is to be reported to the said Commissioners on the part of this Commonwealth, and to accompany the report of the said commissioners to the Governor of this state: *Provided,* That neither the said examination nor any thing contained in the first of these resolutions shall interfere with the use of the said canal the present season; but the Canal Commissioners shall immediately proceed to have the same supplied with water, in the best manner and without further obstructions to the said river.

Resolved by the authority aforesaid, That the Commissioners hereby to be appointed are to receive their reasonable expenses, to be allowed by the Auditor General, and paid out of the State Treasury.

RESOLUTION

Authorizing the Canal Commissioners to change the location of the Philadelphia and Columbia rail-road between the Little and Big Conestoga bridges.

Lanc. corporation allowed to change location.

\$60,000 appropriated. Proviso. Commonwealth not be liable for damages. 2d proviso.

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, That the Canal Commissioners be and they are hereby authorized and required to allow the corporation of the city of Lancaster to change the location of the Philadelphia and Columbia rail-road, between the Little and Big Conestoga bridges so that the same shall pass through the city of Lancaster, at or near the intersection of North Queen and Chestnut streets, and to grade and form the same for a double track of rail-way; for the performance of which work the said Commissioners shall pay to the said corporation a sum not exceeding sixty thousand dollars out of any money appropriated for completing said road: *Provided,* That the Commonwealth shall not be liable to pay for any damages to private property, caused by the location of said road between said bridges: *And provided also,* That said road shall be graded and formed for a double track of rail-way on or be-
