

V. *And be it further resolved by the authority aforesaid,* That we view the American System as a whole, which requires the united and concentrated operation of its friends against all attempts to attack it in detail, and that no steps should be taken to preserve one portion of it at the expense of another.

VI. *And be it further resolved by the authority aforesaid,* That confidence of one interest in the aid and fellowship of another, is the true shield of safety of the friends of the protected industry, and that such confidence should be cultivated and relied on throughout the Union.

VII. *And be it further resolved by the authority aforesaid,* That connected as the prosperity of agriculture and manufactures is with the successful financial operations and sound currency of the country, we view the speedy rechartering of the bank of the United States, with such alterations as may secure the rights of the states, if any be necessary, as of vital importance to the public welfare. --In favor of re-chartering bank.

VIII. *And be it further resolved by the authority aforesaid,* That the Governor be requested to transmit these resolutions to our Senators and Representatives in Congress, to be laid before their respective bodies. Transmission.
