AN ACT

For the relief of John Lehman, John Kitts, Matthias Ritz, Robert Wright and Thomas Abott, soldiers, and Christiana Wilhelm the widow of a soldier of the revolutionary war.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the State Treasurer be and he is hereby authorized and required to pay to John Lehman, of Dauphin county, to John Kitts of Delaware county, and Matthias Ritz, of York county, soldiers, and Christiana Wilhelm, of York county, widow of a soldier of the revolutionary war, or to their respective orders, forty dollars immediately, and an annuity of forty dollars, payable half yearly during life, to commence on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-three. \$40 grat. and ann. granted to J. Lehman, J. Kitts, M. Ritz, and C. Wilhelm.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the State Treasurer be and he is hereby authorized and required to pay to Robert Wright, of Cumberland county, and Thomas Abott of Adams county, or to their respective orders, forty dollars, as a gratuity in full for their revolutionary services. \$40 grat. to R. Wright & T. Abott.

AN ACT

For the relief of sundry soldiers and widows of soldiers of the revolutionary war.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the State Treasurer be and he is hereby au-

thorized and required to pay to Philip Waggoner, of York county, Anthony Shreader, of Berks county, Michael Shingledecker, of Mercer county, and John English, of Lycoming county, soldiers of the revolutionary war, or to their respective orders, forty dollars each immediately, and an annuity of forty dollars each, payable half yearly during life, to commence on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-three.

Same to M. Seybert and M. Harple.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the State Treasurer be and he is hereby authorized and required to pay to Mary Seybert, of Philadelphia county, and Mary Harple of Montgomery county, widows of revolutionary soldiers, or to their respective orders, forty dollars each immediately, and an annuity of forty dollars each, payable half yearly during life, to commence on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-three.

Same to J. Eyer.

SECT. 3. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the State Treasurer be and he is hereby authorized and required to pay to Jacob Eyer of Cumberland county, or to his order, forty dollars immediately, and an annuity of forty dollars during life, payable half yearly, to commence on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-three.

Same to P. Bishop.

SECT. 4. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the State Treasurer be and he is hereby authorized and required to pay to Paul Bishop, of Philadelphia county, a soldier of the revolution, or to his order, the sum of forty dollars immediately, and an annuity of forty dollars, payable half yearly during life, to commence on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-three.

Same to C. Haffernan & E. Beard.

SECT. 5. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the State Treasurer be and he is hereby authorized and required to pay to Catharine Haffernan, of Crawford county, and Elizabeth Beard, of Wayne county, in the state of New York, widows of soldiers of the revolutionary war, or to their respective orders, the sum of forty dollars each immediately, and an annuity of forty dollars each, payable semi-annually during life, to commence on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-three.

\$40 grat. to S. Cross.

SECT. 6. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the State Treasurer be and he is hereby authorized and directed to pay unto Sarah Cross, of Philadelphia county, the widow of a revolutionary soldier, or to her order, the sum of forty dollars in full of her claim as the widow of a revolutionary soldier.
