## AN ACT

For the relief of Dennis Carroll and Frederick Bruner, soldiers, and Ann Carothers and Catharine Keasey, widows of soldiers of the revolutionary war.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the State Treasurer be and he is hereby authorized and required to pay to Dennis Carroll, of Erie county, and Frederick Bruner, of Montgomery county, soldiers of the revolutionary war, or to their respective orders, the sum of forty dollars immediately, and to the said Dennis Carroll or order, an annuity of forty dollars during life, payable half yearly, to commence on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-three. \$40 gratuity to F. Bruner.  
\$40 annuity and gratuity to D. Carroll.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the State Treasurer be and he is hereby authorized and required to pay to Ann Carothers, of Chester county, and Catharine Keisey, of York county, widows of revolutionary soldiers, or to their respective orders, the sum of forty dollars immediately, and an annuity of forty dollars each, during life, payable half yearly, to commence on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-three. Same to A. Carothers & C. Keisey.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the State Treasurer be and he is hereby authorized

A FURTHER SUPPLEMENT

To an act entitled, An act authorizing the Governor to incorporate the Mill Creek and Mine Hill Navigation and Rail Road Company, passed February seventh, eighteen hundred and twenty-eight.

SECT 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of same,* That the stockholders of the Mill Creek and Mine Hill Navigation and Rail Road company, may, after twenty days notice of the time and place, in the papers mentioned in the act to which this is a supplement, hold an election for all the officers they are now by law entitled to elect, who shall continue in office until others are chosen, according to the provisions of the law incorporating the said company;
