A FURTHER SUPPLEMENT

To an act entitled, An act authorizing the Governor to incorporate the Mill Creek and Mine Hill Navigation and Rail Road Company, passed February seventh, eighteen hundred and twenty-eight.

SECT 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of same,* That the stockholders of the Mill Creek and Mine Hill Navigation and Rail Road company, may, after twenty days notice of the time and place, in the papers mentioned in the act to which this is a supplement, hold an election for all the officers they are now by law entitled to elect, who shall continue in office until others are chosen, according to the provisions of the law incorporating the said company;

and the officers so chosen shall have and possess the same power they would have had, if elected on the day prescribed by the said law; and the said company shall not forfeit or lose any of its rights, liberties or franchises, by having neglected to elect officers on the day prescribed by law: *Provido. Similar neglected guarded against in future.* That if it shall hereafter happen that the stockholders of said company should not elect officers for said company on the day mentioned in the act incorporating said company, their charter shall not on that account be forfeited, but may hold the said election at any time thereafter by giving notice as prescribed in the said act.

AN ACT

To amend an act entitled "An act authorizing the Governor to incorporate a company to make an artificial road commencing where the Schuylkill canal road intersects the Ridge turnpike road, near Robinson's mill, thence along the bed of said road to the Flat Rock bridge."

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That from and after the passage of this act, the number of managers be and it is hereby reduced to five, and that three members shall constitute a quorum of the president and managers of the Manayunk and Flat Rock turnpike road, any thing in the act to which this is a supplement to the contrary notwithstanding. *No. of managers reduced, &c.*
