

§40 grat. & ann. granted to J. Kirk, B. Watson, J. Curry, T. Henderson, and T. Clark. county; Benjamin Watson, of Montgomery county; James Curry, of Delaware county; Thomas Henderson, of York county; and Thomas Clark, of Butler county, soldiers of the revolutionary war, or to their respective orders, the sum of forty dollars to each immediately, and an annuity of forty dollars to each during life, payable half yearly, to commence on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-three.

§40 grat. to Adam Lead.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the State Treasurer be and he is hereby authorized and required to pay to Adam Lead, of Lancaster county, a revolutionary soldier, or to his order, forty dollars, as a gratuity for his revolutionary services.

§40 grat. & ann. to C. Rehr.

SECT. 3. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the State Treasurer be and he is hereby authorized and required to pay to Catharine Rehr, of Berks county, the Widow of a revolutionary soldier, or to her order, forty dollars immediately, and an annuity of forty dollars during life, payable half yearly, to commence on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-three.

AN ACT

Authorizing the inhabitants of Windsor township, York county, and Skippack and Perkiomen township, Montgomery county, to elect additional supervisors, and for other purposes.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That from and after the passage of this act, it shall and may be lawful for the electors in Windsor township, York county, to elect annually, at their usual place of electing township officers, three qualified citizens for supervisors

of the roads, subject to the same rules, regulations, and penalties, by which supervisors are by law regulated.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That from and after the passage of this act, it shall and may be lawful for the electors in Skippack and Perkiomen township, Montgomery county, to elect annually, at their usual place of electing township officers, one additional supervisor, who shall reside and superintend the roads on the west side of Perkiomen creek, in the aforesaid township, subject to the same rules and regulations by which supervisors are by law regulated. —Of one for west side of Perkiomen.

SECT. 3. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That from and after the passage of this act, the township of Loyalhanna, in the county of Westmoreland, shall be a separate election district, and the elections in said district shall be held at the house now occupied by Robert Nicholson, in said township; and that the elections for officers of the said township, shall be held by the citizens thereof at the same place, until otherwise ordered by the said citizens, in the manner prescribed by law. Loyalhanna township, in Westmoreland co. erected into a separate election district, &c.

SECT. 4. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That so much of the second section of the act of the General Assembly, passed on the fourth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-one, regulating the roads and highways in the counties of Crawford, Venango, and Warren, as authorizes the assessing of an additional road tax on the male inhabitants of the several townships in those counties, be, and the same is hereby repealed, so far as respects the said county of Crawford. Part of 2d sect. of act of 4th April, 1831, relating to Crawford co. repealed.

SECT. 5. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That from and after the passage of this act, the provisions of the first, second, third, fourth, fifth, and sixth sections of an act entitled "An act to alter the mode of electing supervisors of public highways, and township auditors, and for the election of town clerks within the county of Bradford, and for other purposes," passed the third day of May, Anno Domini eighteen hundred and thirty-two, be, and the same is hereby extended to the counties of M'Kean and Potter: *Provided,* That the time of choosing such supervisors, township auditors, and town clerks shall remain as it now is, by the seventy-third section of "An act regulating elections," passed the third day of May, Anno Domini one thousand eight hundred and thirty-two." Certain provisions of act 3d of May, 1832, extended to counties of M'Kean and Potter. Proviso.
