## A FURTHER SUPPLEMENT

To an act entitled "An act for the promotion of agriculture and domestic manufactures."

**SECT. 1.** *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the act entitled "An act for the promotion of agriculture and domestic manufactures," passed the sixth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and twenty, and the provisions of the second section of a supplement thereto, passed the fourteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and twenty seven, are hereby re-enacted and extended for the further term of five years from and after the sixth day of March, eighteen hundred and thirty-three, so far as respects the counties of Washington and Greene.

Certain provisions of former acts extended 5 years.

## AN ACT

Providing for the inspection of Spirituous Liquors in the boroughs of Columbia and Washington, in the county of Lancaster, and in the town of Wrightsville, in the county of York.

**SECT. 1.** *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the Governor of this Commonwealth be, and he is hereby directed, on or before the first day of May next, to appoint and commission a fit person, who shall reside in the borough of Columbia, to be gauger and inspector of domestic distilled spirits in the said borough of Columbia, and county of Lancaster; and also, a fit person, who shall reside in the borough of Washington, in said county, to be gauger and

inspector of domestic distilled spirits, in the said borough, and in the township of Manor.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That each of the persons who shall be appointed, in compliance with the requisition of the foregoing section, shall, prior to the performance of any of the duties prescribed by this act, execute bonds to the Governor on behalf of the Commonwealth, in the sum of five hundred dollars, with one or more sufficient sureties, conditioned for the faithful performance of the duties imposed on them by this act; and if the said inspectors, or either of them, shall make use of a false hydrometer or gauging instrument, knowing them to be such, or in any other manner misbehave, or abuse the power hereby granted to them, the Governor shall cause said bonds to be put in suit, and the said inspectors shall each take and subscribe an oath or affirmation, before some judge or justice of the peace, in the city or county of Lancaster, in the words following, to wit: I, A. B., do swear or affirm, (as the case may be,) that I will honestly and faithfully gauge, inspect, and mark spirituous liquors, of domestic manufacture, to the best of my skill, in the manner directed by the act, entitled "An act providing for the inspection of spirituous liquors," passed the fourteenth day of March, eighteen hundred and fourteen, and the supplement thereto, passed the thirteenth day of March, eighteen hundred and fifteen; and the said inspectors, before they enter on the duties of their office, shall cause a certified copy of such oath or affirmation to be filed in the office of the prothonotary of the court of Common Pleas of the county aforesaid.

Inspectors bonds.

Their oaths, &c.

SECT. 3. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That each of the said inspectors, before they shall proceed to execute the duties prescribed by this act, shall procure a correct set of gauging instruments, that is to say, scales, callipers, and rod; and also, Decca's Liverpool patent hydrometer, and they are hereby required to keep the same constantly in good order, and perform the duties enjoined in the acts aforesaid: *Provided,* That the duties enjoined in the tenth section of the said act, upon the mayor of the city of Philadelphia, shall be performed by any justice of the peace of the county of Lancaster, to whom application may be made for the purpose provided for in said section.

Inspectors to procure and keep in order gauging instruments.

Proviso.

SECT. 4. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the vendor of each cask, barrel, or hogshead, of domestic distilled spirits, shall pay twelve and a half cents to the inspector, who shall have gauged, inspected, and marked the same.

Inspectors to be paid by vender.

SECT. 5. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the Governor be, and he is hereby authorized and required, on or before the first day of April next, to appoint and commission a fit person, residing in or near the town of

Wrightsville, in the county of York, to be a gauger and inspector of domestic distilled spirits, for the town of Wrightsville, in the county aforesaid, who shall give a bond to the Governor on behalf of the Commonwealth, in the sum of two hundred dollars, with one or more sufficient sureties, for the faithful performance of the duties imposed on him by this act, he shall take and subscribe the same oath or affirmation, and file the same in the prothonotary's office of the county aforesaid; procure the same kind of instruments; perform the like duties; be subject to the same penalties; and receive the like fees—to be subject to all and singular the same rules and regulations that are provided in the preceding sections of this act for the inspection of spirituous liquor, in and for the borough of Columbia, in the county of Lancaster: *Provided*, That the duties in the third section of this act, required to be performed by some judge or justice of the peace, in the city or county of Lancaster, shall be performed by some judge or justice of the peace, of the county of York.

AN ACT

To incorporate the "Philadelphia Fire company."

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That all and every the persons who shall, at the time of the passing of this act, be members of the association called the Philadelphia Fire company, shall be and they are hereby created and declared to be one body politic and corporate by the name, style and title of "The Philadelphia Fire company;" and by the same name shall have perpetual succession, and shall be able to sue and be sued, implead and
