SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That information given to, and the service of any summons upon one of the gate keepers or toll-gatherers of any turnpike company next to where such obstructions may be found, shall be as good and valid in law as if given to or served upon the president or other principal officer, or the treasurer, secretary or chief clerk of any turnpike company as aforesaid.

SECT. 3. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That no carter or teamster shall leave his wagon or team stand during the night within less than ten feet of the centre of the turnpike road, under a penalty of five dollars for each and every offence, to be recovered on conviction thereof before any justice of the peace of the proper county, with costs of suit, the one half for the use of the prosecutor, and the other half to and for the repair of the roads in the township where such offence may be committed.

AN ACT

Further to extend the provisions of "An act relative to the patenting of lands," passed the eighth day of April, eighteen hundred and twenty-nine.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That all the provisions of the act entitled "An act relative to the patenting of lands," passed the eighth day of April, Anno Domini eighteen hundred and twenty-nine, and also of the act to extend the provisions of the foregoing act, passed the twenty-first day of March, Anno Domini eighteen hundred and thirty-one, be and the same are here-

by extended, and shall continue in full force and operation for the term of one year from and after the eighth day of April, Anno Domini eighteen hundred and thirty-three.

AN ACT

For the relief of Robert Campbell, Frederick Baum, James M'Dowell, Michael Rager, Job Helms, and Samuel Shaw, soldiers, and Justina Weiser, and Margaret Dentsler, the widows of soldiers of the revolutionary war.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the State Treasurer be and he is hereby \$40 grat. and authorized and required to pay to Robert Campbell, of Perry county; Frederick Baum and James M'Dowell, of Mifflin county, soldiers of the revolution, or to their respective or- ders, forty dollars to each immediately, and an annuity of forty dollars each during life, to commence on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-three.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority afore-said,* That the State Treasurer be and he is hereby author- ized and required to pay Job Helms and Samuel Shaw, of the county of Delaware, a gratuity of forty dollars to each for their revolutionary services.

SECT. 3. *And be it further enacted by the authority afore-said,* That the State Treasurer be and he is hereby author- ized and required to pay to Justina Weiser, of Dauphin county, the widow of a revolutionary soldier, or to her order, forty dollars immediately, and an annuity of forty dollars during life, to commence on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-three.
