SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid*, That it shall be the duty of the president and managers of said company, upon the issuing of the Governor's warrant for the state's subscription authorized in this act, to cause certificates of shares of stock, to the amount thereof, to be deposited at the treasury of this Commonwealth, and the dividends upon the shares so deposited shall thenceforth, from time to time, be paid into the said treasury.

SECT. 3. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid*, That from and after the first Monday of January next, the whole number of managers shall be ten in said company, of which the state shall have two, to be appointed by the Governor, who may remove and supply their places by others, when necessary.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same*, That the State Treasurer be and he is hereby authorized and required to pay to Henry Erb, Christian Specht, Christopher Car and John Reed, of Montgomery county,

AN ACT

Relative to certain streets, alleys and public landings, in the county of Philadelphia and in the city of Pittsburg, and for other purposes.

WHEREAS, by an act passed the first day of April, eighteen hundred and thirty-one, entitled "An act relative to certain streets and alleys in the city of Pittsburg, and for other purposes," the damages accruing by the opening of Ferry street, in the city of Pittsburg, from Fourth to Liberty street, have been apportioned upon each of the owners of property benefited thereby, in proportion to the value respectively accruing to each of the lots, or parts of lots owned by them, and the viewers appointed under the said act have filed their appraisal and apportionment in the court of Quarter Sessions for Allegheny county, and the same has been recorded at large upon the docket of said court, binding and concluding all parties owning, or claiming to own the premises affected thereby: *And whereas*, it has been held that the remedy provided in the fifth section of said act, for enforcing payment, applies exclusively to the provisions immediately antecedent thereto, which relate to Grant street and Cherry alley, by means whereof the legislative provisions, in reference to Ferry street, cannot be carried into effectual execution: Therefore,

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the remedy provided in the fifth section of said act, for enforcing payment of any assessment or charge, shall be and is hereby expressly declared applicable to the sums apportioned in the report of the viewers, under the second section of said act; and the money, when recovered,
