AN ACT

Supplementary to an act entitled "An act to enable the Governor of this Commonwealth, to incorporate a company for making an artificial road, from the intersection of Front street and the Germantown road, in the Northern Liberties, of the city of Philadelphia, through Frankford and Bristol, to the ferry at Morrisville, on the river Delaware.

Preamble.

WHEREAS it has been agreed between the president, managers and company, of the Frankford and Bristol turnpike pike road, and the commissioners and the inhabitants of the Kensington district of the Northern Liberties, that the former shall cede and the latter accept and forever keep in repair, a portion of the said turnpike road: Therefore,

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That from and after the passage of this act, the president, managers and company of the Frankford and Bristol turnpike road, shall cede to the commissioners and inhabitants of the Kensington district, in the Northern Liberties, and their successors, all their right, title, interest, privileges and jurisdiction, into and over so much of their said turnpike road as is within the present limits of the said Kensington district, to be kept open as a public highway and used, levelled, regulated, repaired and otherwise governed as other streets are in the said district, by the commissioners thereof, without any expense whatever to the said turnpike road company, and so much of said road so ceded to said commissioners shall cease to be the property of or under the jurisdiction of the said turnpike company.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the said commissioners and inhabitants shall be bound to keep at their own expense, so much of the said turnpike road as is hereby ceded to them, under the provisions of this act, in perfect and complete order and repair: and that so soon as the said commissioners and inhabitants of the Kensington district aforesaid, shall pave or cause to be paved, as streets are now usually paved, so much of the said turnpike road hereby ceded and relinquished to them, as is included between the south western line of the said Kensington district and Masters street, then the president, managers and company of the Frankford and Bristol turnpike road aforesaid, shall thenceforth cease to ask, demand and receive tolls for so much of the said road as is within the limits of the said Kensington district, and shall within one month thereafter, remove all gates, cranes, or other obstructions erected or placed by them across the said turnpike road south of the lane known by the name of the Hart lane.

SECT. 3. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That so much of any act of Assembly, as is hereby altered or supplied, be and the same is hereby repealed.
