## AN ACT

To annul the marriage contract of Jehu Hatfield and Harriet his wife.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the marriage contract entered into by and between Jehu Hatfield and Harriet his wife, be and the same is hereby made void, and the parties released and discharged from the said contract, and from all duties and obligations arising therefrom, as fully, effectually and absolutely, as if they had never been joined in marriage.

## AN ACT

To authorize Jacob Kern, administrator of the estate of George Palmer, deceased, to sell and convey certain real estate.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That Jacob Kern, administrator of the goods and chattels, rights and credits of George Palmer, late of the county of Northampton, deceased, be, and he is hereby authorized to sell and convey all the unimproved lands of which the said George Palmer died seized and possessed, at public or private sale, as the said Jacob Kern shall deem most conducive to the interests of the heirs of said George Palmer, deceased, and to make and execute good and sufficient deeds to the purchasers, as well for the lands sold previous to the passage of this act, as well as for those to be sold in pursu-

ance of this act: *Provided*, That the sales to be made in pursuance of this act shall not be valid, until reported to and approved by the Orphan's court of Northampton county: *And provided further*, That the said Jacob Kern shall enter into bond or recognizance, with such surety as the said Orphan's court shall direct, for the faithful discharge of his duty, and the proper application of the money arising from said sales.

AN ACT

Declaring Cheat river, in the county of Fayette, a public highway.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same*, That from and after the passage of this act, Cheat river, from the mouth thereof, and up the said stream as far as the Virginia state line, be, and the same is hereby declared a public highway.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid*, That the Governor be, and he is hereby authorized and required to draw his warrant on the State Treasurer, in favour of Joseph Enix, Isaac Crow and James M'Cortney, of Fayette county, for five hundred dollars, who are hereby appointed commissioners to expend the same; who shall have power to cause to be removed all obstructions which impede or injure the navigation of said river Cheat, by removing rocks and other obstructions within the channel of said river, from the mouth of the aforesaid river up the same to the Virginia state line, and the said improvement to commence as early during the present year as convenient, and for that purpose to employ suitable persons to perform said work.

\$500 appropriated to be expended under direction of certain commissioners, in improvement of navigation.

SECT. 3. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid*, That the said commissioners shall each be entitled to receive one dollar and fifty cents per day, for every day neces-
