A SUPPLEMENT

To the act entitled, "An act for the improvement of the state," approved the twenty-sixth day of March, A. D. one thousand eight hundred and twenty-one.

Preamble.

WHEREAS, by an act of Assembly of this Commonwealth, approved the twenty-sixth day of March, Anno Domini, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-one, entitled "An act for the improvement of the state," the sum of ten thousand dollars was appropriated for improving the navigation of the river Delaware, three thousand dollars of which was directed to be expended on that part of the said river between the foot of Foul Rift and Chambers' wharf: *And whereas*, one thousand dollars of the said three thousand is not yet drawn from the treasury of this Commonwealth, and the commissioners appointed for that purpose neglected to draw and expend the same: Therefore,

Comm'rs. appointed to superintend expenditure of an unexpended balance of \$1000 appropriated to Delaware river.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That Jacob Lamb and Jesse Gibbs, of Northampton county, be and they are hereby appointed commissioners to lay out and expend the said sum of one thousand dollars yet undrawn and unexpended, which they shall lay out and expend in the improvement of the river Delaware, between the mouth of Smithfield creek and the mouth of the river Lehigh; and they shall have like powers and privileges, and be subject to like restrictions and duties, and give like security for the faithful expenditure of said money, as are granted to, imposed upon and required of the commissioners appointed by the original act.
