last will and testament of Richard McCall, late of the city of Philadelphia, deceased, be, and he is hereby authorized and empowered to sell and convey, in fee simple or otherwise, the one third part of a certain lot of ground situate on Hudson's lane, in the district of Moyamensing and county of Philadelphia, and devised by the third clause of the will of the said Richard McCall, to the said Thomas Cadwalader in trust for certain purposes therein mentioned, and the deed or deeds of conveyance therefor executed by the said Thomas Cadwalader to the purchaser or purchasers, his or their heirs and assigns, shall be deemed and taken to pass and convey the said third part of the said lot of ground in the same manner, and to have the same effect as if this power to sell and convey the same had been given to him by the will of the said testator, the proceeds of the said sale to be held by the said trustee, in the same manner, and for the same persons and purposes, and with the same discretion as if the same had continued real estate: *Provided*, That the said sale shall be reported to, and approved by the Orphan's Court of the county of Philadelphia.

AN ACT

To improve the state road leading from the top of the Allegheny mountain, at the White Horse Tavern in Somerset county, to Connelville, in Fayette county.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the sum of two thousand dollars be, and the same is hereby appropriated for the purpose of improving the state road from the top of the Allegheny mountain, at

the White Horse tavern in Somerset county, to Connelsville in Fayette county; and the Governor is hereby authorized and required, on or before the first day of June next, to draw his warrant on the State Treasurer in favor of Joseph Rogers, Solomon Kerns of Fayette county, and George Gebhart of Somerset county, for the aforesaid sum of two thousand dollars, to be expended by them in improving said road, to be paid to them or their order, on their entering into a bond to the Commonwealth with two or more sufficient sureties, for the faithful and judicious expenditure of the said money in improving said road, within one year after receiving said money, which sureties shall be approved of by the court of Common Pleas for the county of Fayette, and the said road commissioners shall receive one dollar and fifty cents for every day necessarily spent in performing the duties required by this act, which sum shall be paid out of the treasuries of Somerset and Fayette counties respectively and equally, and the accounts of the said commissioners shall be settled with the Auditor General in the usual way.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the said road commissioners shall, within one year from the first day of June next, or as soon thereafter as conveniently may be, after being sworn or affirmed, make report to the court of General Quarter Sessions of the county of Fayette, and upon such report so made, the court is directed to appoint three respectable citizens, inhabitants of the counties of Fayette and Somerset, whose duty it shall be to view said road and make report of the same to the said court, particularly setting forth whether or not the said money was judiciously expended, agreeably to the provisions of said act; and if the report shall be accepted by the said court, then and in that case the said bond shall be null and void: *Provided,* That the said citizens so appointed, shall receive one dollar and fifty cents each, for each and every day necessarily spent by them in discharge of these duties, which sum shall be paid out of the treasuries of Somerset and Fayette counties respectively.
