AN ACT

To incorporate the "Conneauttee Library company," in the county of Erie, and for other purposes.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the Conneauttee Library company, in the county of Erie, is hereby erected into one body politic and corporate, in deed and in law, by the name, style and title of "The Conneauttee Library company," and by the same name shall have perpetual succession, and be able to sue and be sued, in all courts of law and elsewhere, and shall be able and capable in law and equity, to take and hold for the use of the said library, any goods and chattels, or any sum or sums of money, by gift, grant, bargain, sale, will, devise or bequest, from any person or persons, whomsoever capable of making the same, and the same to grant, bargain and sell for the use of the said library, and generally to do all and singular, the matters and things which shall be lawful for them to do, for the well being and due management of the affairs thereof: *Provided,* That the real, personal property or money, of which the said company may at any time be possessed of shall as soon as it conveniently can be invested in books for the said library.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That this library company shall consist of all such persons as are now members, or shall hereafter be admitted as such, agreeably to the by-laws of said company.

Members of association.

SECT. 3. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the officers of the said library company, shall con-

Officers.

sist of one president, one vice president, five trustees, three auditors, one librarian, one treasurer and one secretary, the duties of the aforesaid officers, shall be particularly enumerated in the by-laws of said company.

Annual election.

SECT. 4. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the officers enumerated in this act, with the exception of the secretary, shall be chosen by ballot, at a general meeting of the said library company, on the first Monday in January, annually, to continue in office for one year, or until their successors are elected, and the secretary shall be appointed by the president.

Appropriation of funds.

SECT. 5. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the funds of this company, shall be raised by stock and instalments, and shall be exclusively appropriated to the purchase of books and the necessary apparatus for the library.

By-laws.

SECT. 6. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the company shall have power at any general meeting, to make such by-laws as may be deemed necessary for its better regulation: *Provided,* That such by-laws are not repugnant to, or inconsistent with the constitution and laws of this state or of the United States.

Proviso.

Reservation of right to repeal.

SECT. 7. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the Legislature reserves the right to alter, amend or annul this charter at any time hereafter.

Certain privileges granted to the Delaware and N. America coal companies.

SECT. 8. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the Delaware Coal company and North America Coal company, shall respectively for five years and no longer, have the same corporate powers and privileges, and be subject to the same restrictions imposed upon the Lycoming Coal company; and that the Delaware Coal company and North America Coal company, shall respectively hold lands in Schuylkill county, not exceeding fifteen hundred acres, and shall respectively create a capital stock, not exceeding three hundred thousand dollars, to be divided by each of them into a convenient number of shares: *Provided,* That the powers here created, shall cease, unless said companies relinquish charters obtained from other states, and that this section may be repealed whenever the Legislature may think proper.
