

"An act concerning the borough of Reading," passed the eighteenth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and fourteen, as relates to the election of supervisors, be and the same are hereby repealed.

SECT. 3. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the town council of the borough of Reading, in Council authorized to borrow money, &c. council assembled, shall have full power and authority, by ordinance or resolution, to borrow for the use of said borough, any sum or sums of money which they may deem necessary, and to lay taxes for the re-payment of all loans already made for the use of the said borough, for the re-payment of which the faith of the said borough now is, or hereafter may be pledged.

AN ACT

Authorizing the construction of a wagon road on the berm bank of sections eighty-eight and eighty-nine of the North Branch division of the Pennsylvania canal.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the canal commissioners be, and they are hereby directed, in making the necessary repairs on sections eighty-eight and eighty-nine on the North Branch division of the Pennsylvania canal, so to conduct the same as to accommodate, as far as said repairs may, the formation of a wagon road on the berm bank of said sections. SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the canal commissioners be, and they are hereby directed, to permit the president and managers of the Cata-

AN ACT

For the relief of Mary Ziegler, the widow of a soldier of the revolutionary war, and the heirs of John Thompson, deceased, of Mercer county,

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the State Treasurer be, and he is hereby authorized and required to pay Mary Ziegler, of York county, the widow of a revolutionary soldier, or to her order, the sum of forty dollars immediately, and an annuity of forty dollars, payable half yearly during life, to commence on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-three.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the State Treasurer be and he is hereby authorized and required to pay to the heirs or legal representatives of John Thompson, late of Mercer county, deceased, or to their order, the sum of two hundred and seventy one dollars, in full for a tract of donation land which was granted to Joseph Roe, as a reward for his services as a revolutionary soldier, whose right and interest therein became legally vested in the said John Thompson, situate in what is called the struck donation, in the second district, number three hundred and
