## A FURTHER SUPPLEMENT

To the act entitled An act for the regulation of the militia of this Commonwealth.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the militia within the bounds of the fifty-eighth regiment, second brigade, fifteenth division, shall hereafter form one battalion, to be called Clarion, and the election held on the twenty-third day of January, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-two, for field officers thereof, shall be good and valid, and also the election or appointment of company officers subsequent to that date; and the aforesaid battalion shall be entitled to one Lieutenant Colonel and one Major, with the proper staff.

## AN ACT

For the relief of John Johnston, John Curtis, Michael Fee, Ozburn Hillery, Isaac Jones, and Robert Pefeng, soldiers, and Catharine Kinsey, the widow of a revolutionary soldier.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the State Treasurer be, and he is hereby authorized and required to pay to John Johnston, of Greene county; John Curtis, Michael Fee, Ozborn Hillery, of Fayette county; Isaac Jones, of York county, soldiers of the war of the revolution, or to their respective orders, forty dollars to each immediately, and an annuity of forty dollars to each, during life, to commence on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-three.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the State Treasurer be, and he is hereby authorized and required to pay to Catharine Kinsey, of Bucks county, the widow of a soldier of the revolutionary war, or to her order, the sum of forty dollars immediately, and an annuity of forty dollars during life, to commence on the first of January, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-three. Same to Catharine Kinsey.

SECT. 3. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the State Treasurer be, and he is hereby authorized and required to pay to Robert Peleng, of the county of York, or his order, two hundred and fifty dollars, in full, compensation for a tract of donation land to which he was entitled, for services rendered by him in the revolutionary war. \$250 to R. Peleng for donation land

## No. 152.

### AN ACT

Declaring a certain part of Shamokin creek, in the county of Northumberland, a public highway.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That from and after the passing of this act Shamokin creek, in the county of Northumberland, from Samuel Sober's mill to its confluence with the Susquehanna, be, and the same is hereby declared a public highway, and it shall and may be lawful for any person or persons desirous of improving or using the navigation of said stream, to remove thereout all obstructions except dams for mills and other water works, already built, on which dams any such person or persons as aforesaid shall have full power to make slopes, such as are hereinafter described, and to keep the same in repair for the passage of boats, rafts and other craft: *Provided,* That such slopes be so constructed as not to injure such dams. From Sober's mill to junction with Susquehanna Proviso.
