

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the State Treasurer be, and he is hereby authorized and required to pay to Catharine Kinsey, of Bucks county, the widow of a soldier of the revolutionary war, or to her order, the sum of forty dollars immediately, and an annuity of forty dollars during life, to commence on the first of January, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-three. Same to Catharine Kinsey.

SECT. 3. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the State Treasurer be, and he is hereby authorized and required to pay to Robert Peleng, of the county of York, or his order, two hundred and fifty dollars, in full, compensation for a tract of donation land to which he was entitled, for services rendered by him in the revolutionary war. \$250 to R. Peleng for donation land

AN ACT

Declaring a certain part of Shamokin creek, in the county of Northumberland, a public highway.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That from and after the passing of this act Shamokin creek, in the county of Northumberland, from Samuel Sober's mill to its confluence with the Susquehanna, be, and the same is hereby declared a public highway, and it shall and may be lawful for any person or persons desirous of improving or using the navigation of said stream, to remove thereout all obstructions except dams for mills and other water works, already built, on which dams any such person or persons as aforesaid shall have full power to make slopes, such as are hereinafter described, and to keep the same in repair for the passage of boats, rafts and other craft: *Provided,* That such slopes be so constructed as not to injure such dams. From Sober's mill to junction with Susquehanna Proviso.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That nothing in this act contained shall be deemed, *Of the rights of landholders to erect dams.* taken or understood to prevent any person or persons, owning or possessing lands on or adjoining said stream, who independent of the passage of this act, would have a right under the general laws of this Commonwealth to erect a dam or dams across the said stream, from erecting such dam or dams: *Provided, nevertheless,* That every such dam be so constructed with a proper slope, erected in the most convenient and proper part thereof, so that crafts may not be obstructed in passing down the said stream, which slope shall be sufficiently wide to admit the crafts usually run upon said stream, and be one foot at least lower than the other parts of the dam, the surface of which slope shall be composed of wood or other suitable materials, well compacted together, and for every foot in height shall extend fifteen feet down stream.

Proviso.
Dams to have slopes of certain dimensions.

AN ACT

To authorize John Everhart to erect a wing dam in Juniata river.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That John Everhart, of Juniata township, Perry county, his heirs or assigns, be and he is hereby authorized to erect a wing dam in the Juniata river, on the east side thereof, at or near the Juniata falls, for the purpose of creating and using water power: *Provided,* That in so doing, he shall not in any degree interrupt or impede the navigation thereof, or injure private property.

Near the Juniata falls.

Proviso.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That in case any individual shall sustain any injury to his private property, by reason of the erection of said dam,
