Chicquies and Marietta road and bridge company, be and they are hereby authorized to construct and extend their road from the present termination at the eastern abutment of the old bridge over the Susquehanna, along or near the berm bank of the canal basin, so as to intersect Front street in the borough of Columbia, in a straight line, and terminate at or near the abutment of the new bridge now building across the Susquehanna, opposite the said borough: *Provided*, That no toll gate be erected thereon; or any toll charged for traveling on this part of the road thus authorized to be made and extended: *Provided*, That the extension of the road hereby authorized, shall be so located and constructed, subject to the approval of the board of canal commissioners, as not to interfere with any part of the public works, or any plan for their continuance and completion which may be adopted by the proper authorities.

AN ACT

Relating to lots of ground appropriated to the use of the Commonwealth for collectors, weighmasters and lock keepers on the Pennsylvania canal and rail road.

Canal com-
missioners
authorized to
purchase lots.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same*, That where lots of ground are required for collectors, weighmasters and lock keepers, and the same cannot be obtained at a price, which in the opinion of the canal commissioners, shall be fair and equitable, or where a good and sufficient title for such lot cannot be conveyed to the Commonwealth, the canal commissioners are hereby authorized to survey and lay off a lot of ground for each collector, weighmaster and lock keeper as aforesaid, in the same manner that ground is taken and occupied for other necessary

purposes on the canal and rail road: *Provided*, Such lot does not exceed half an acre; and the value thereof shall be assessed and paid as damages are now assessed and paid on the Pennsylvania canal and rail road. Proviso. Not to exceed half an acre, &c.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid*, That all property belonging to the Commonwealth, upon the Pennsylvania canal and rail road, shall be exempt from taxation. Exemption of state property from taxation.

AN ACT

For the better employment and support of the poor within the township of Roxborough, in the county of Philadelphia.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same*, That the provisions of the act, entitled "An act for the better employment, relief and support of the poor, within the township of Germantown, in the county of Philadelphia," passed the thirty-first day of March, in the year eighteen hundred and nine, be and the same are hereby extended to the township of Roxborough, in the said county, and that Amos A. Jones, Joseph Gilkison, Samuel H. Slingluff, Alexander Quinton, Michael Levering and Charles Righter, are hereby appointed managers, to carry the said act into effect: *Provided*, That any two of said managers, shall have power to admit and remove applicants and paupers, any thing in the said act, to the contrary notwithstanding. Provisions of act of 31st March, 1809, extended to township of Roxborough. Under direction of managers.
