SECT. 17. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the third, fourth, fifth, sixth, seventh, eighth, ninth, tenth, eleventh, twelfth, thirteenth, and fourteenth sections of the foregoing act, be, and they are hereby extended to the last mentioned company, to all intents and purposes.

AN ACT

Directing the collection of a debt due to the Commonwealth.

Preamble:

WHEREAS it appears from sundry public documents, that a contract was entered into by the mayor, aldermen and citizens of Pittsburg with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, for the guarantee by the said mayor, aldermen and citizens to this Commonwealth, of the payment under certain conditions and provisions of the excess of expenditure in the construction of a canal through the city of Pittsburg, beyond the sum of sixty five thousand five hundred and sixty seven dollars thirty five cents, and a dispute has arisen as to the performance of said contract and the amount due on said guaranty: Therefore,

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the Auditor General be and is hereby directed to apply to the mayor, aldermen and citizens of Pittsburg, for

the sum of forty three thousand nine hundred and six dollars and sixty-three cents, the amount expended by the agents of the Commonwealth, on the canal improvements in the said city, over and above the sum of sixty-five thousand five hundred and sixty-seven dollars and thirty-five cents.

Aud. General directed to demand from corporation of Pittsburg \$43,906 63.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That if the Auditor General does not obtain from the mayor, aldermen and citizens of the said city of Pittsburg, within three months after the passing of this act, a settlement of the aforesaid claims, then the Governor is hereby instructed to institute legal proceedings in the name of this Commonwealth, against the said mayor, aldermen and citizens of Pittsburg, in the Circuit court of Allegheny county, which court shall have full power and jurisdiction in this case, to proceed to try the cause as in other cases: *Provided,* That the venire for the trial of said cause shall be issued to Westmoreland county, and twenty four jurors shall be drawn, summoned and returned from the said county of Westmoreland, by the sheriff thereof, in the usual manner, and the said jurors shall be entitled to the usual pay and mileage, to be paid by the county of Allegheny.

In case of non-payment within 3 months, Governor instructed to institute suit.

Proviso. Issue of venire to Westmoreland co.

SECT. 3. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the sheriff of Allegheny county, shall, and is hereby authorized to serve all process in like manner as process is served in other cases, against corporations.

Sheriff of Allegheny to serve process.
