SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That if the Auditor General does not obtain from the mayor, aldermen and citizens of the said city of Pittsburg, within three months after the passing of this act, a settlement of the aforesaid claims, then the Governor is hereby instructed to institute legal proceedings in the name of this Commonwealth, against the said mayor, aldermen and citizens of Pittsburg, in the Circuit court of Allegheny county, which court shall have full power and jurisdiction in this case, to proceed to try the cause as in other cases: *Provided,* That the venire for the trial of said cause shall be issued to Westmoreland county, and twenty four jurors shall be drawn, summoned and returned from the said county of Westmoreland, by the sheriff thereof, in the usual manner, and the said jurors shall be entitled to the usual pay and mileage, to be paid by the county of Allegheny.

In case of non-payment within 3 months, Governor instructed to institute suit.

SECT. 3. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the sheriff of Allegheny county, shall, and is hereby authorized to serve all process in like manner as process is served in other cases, against corporations.

AN ACT

Regulating Election Districts.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the electors of the township of Brooklyn, in Susquehanna county, shall hold their general elections at the house now occupied by Jesse Bagley, in said township.

- Great Bend.** **SECT. 2.** *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the electors of the township of Great Bend, in Susquehanna county, shall hereafter hold their general elections at the house now occupied by Benjamin Taylor, in said township.
- Dimock.** **SECT. 3.** *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the township of Dimock, in Susquehanna county, shall be a separate election district, and the electors thereof shall hold their general elections at the house now occupied by John Baker, in said township.
- Thomson.** **SECT. 4.** *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the township of Thomson, in Susquehanna county, shall be a separate election district, and the electors thereof shall hold their general elections at the house now occupied by Jonas Blandin, in said township.

Sharp's house; thence to the Adams county line, where it is intersected by the Green and Southampton line; thence along the Adams county line to the Washington township line, and thence along the last line to the place beginning, shall be an election district, and the voters within said bounds shall hold their general elections, and elections for inspectors, at the Fayetteville school house, in Green township.

SECT. 54. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That it shall be the duty of the inspector of votes for the township of Hanover, in the county of Washington, at the next general election, to receive tickets from the citizens thereof, qualified to vote at such general election, and to deposit them in a proper box to be for that purpose provided by the proper officers, which tickets shall be labelled with the words "election district," and within, the words "for a removal," or "against a removal," and folded and delivered and received in the usual manner.

SECT. 55. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the said elections shall in all respects be conducted as the general elections in this Commonwealth are now conducted; and it shall be the duty of the judges of said township, first having carefully ascertained the number

of votes given for or against the removal of the election district, to make out a return thereof, which return shall be lodged in the office of the clerk of the court of Quarter Sessions of said county, and if it shall appear that there is a majority of the electors of said township in favor of a removal of the election district, from thenceforth the general election for said district shall be held at the school house in the town of Florence.

SECT. 60. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the electors residing in the townships of Tobey and Red Bank, in the county of Armstrong, within the following described bounds, shall hereafter be a separate election district: beginning at the mouth of Mahoning creek; thence up the Allegheny river to a point one mile above the mouth of Cat Fish run; thence a straight line to the corner of Red Bank and Clarion townships; thence along the line of said townships to Leatherwood creek; thence down said creek to its mouth, at Red Bank creek; thence up Red Bank to the southern extremity of the Big Bend; thence due south to Mahoning creek; thence down said creek to the beginning, and that the place of holding the general election shall be at the school house at Lawsensham.

SECT. 61. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the general elections for the township of Lower Mahanoy, in the county of Northumberland, shall be held at the house now occupied by Solomon Ressler, in Georgetown.

AN ACT

Authorizing the Governor to incorporate a company to extend the West Chester rail road into and along the streets of the borough, and for other purposes.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That William Everhart, Eber Worthington, Thomas S. Bell, Captain William Apple and James Tillum, of the borough of West Chester, are hereby appointed commissioners to perform the several matters herein provided for, to wit: they or any three of them shall procure suitable books in which shall be entered as follows: "We and each of us whose names are hereunto subscribed, promise to pay to the directors of the West Chester extended rail road company," the sum of twenty dollars for every share of stock set opposite our names and by us respectively subscribed, in such manner and proportions, and at such times and places as shall be fixed on by the directors of the aforesaid rail road company, and shall thereupon give due notice in at least two newspapers published in said borough, or in handbills at their discretion, of the time and places where the commissioners or a majority of them will attend to receive subscriptions; the books to be kept open from one till five o'clock, P. M. for three days unless five hundred and fifty shares shall be sooner subscribed, if however at the end of three days that number of shares shall not be subscribed, the commissioners may adjourn from time to time, until the same are subscribed, giving notice as afore-*
