WHEREAS by a resolution passed at the last session of this legislature and approved by the Governor of this Commonwealth, on the fifth day of April, eighteen hundred and thirty-two, Isaac Griffith, late deputy marshal of the Eastern district of Pennsylvania, was exonerated from the payment of a certain judgment obtained against him in the court of Common Pleas of Bucks county, at the suit of the Commonwealth, but not from the payment of costs of said suit: *And whereas,* The same principle on which the amount of the judgment was released should extend to the costs: Therefore, Preamble.
