RESOLUTION

For the relief of William B. Mitchell.

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met
 That the Auditor General be authorized to settle the account of William B. Mitchell, superintendent of the Philadelphia and Columbia rail road, for the moneys not exceeding ten hundred and thirty dollars, by him expended in the months of October and November, Anno Domini, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-two, in procuring physicians, medicine, and a temporary hospital to attend and accommodate the laborers employed on the Eastern Division of said rail road, during the prevalence of the Asiatic cholera, to be paid out of the funds appropriated to the said road.

Aud. General authorized to settle account for expenses incurred during prevalence of cholera on rail road.

RESOLUTION

Relative to pay of Clerk hire in the Auditor General's office, and contingent expenses in the office of the Secretary of the Land Office, and for other purposes.

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met,
 That the sum of eight hundred dollars be, and is hereby appropriated for clerk hire, in the office of the Auditor General, for one year from the first day of April, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-three; and the sum of three hundred dollars be, and is hereby appropriated, for the contingent expenses of the office of the Secretary of the Land Office.

\$800 appropriated for clerk hire in office of Aud. Gen. and \$300 for expenses of Land Office.

Resolved, by the authority aforesaid, That so much of the act "to establish the Western Bank of Philadelphia," and

the act to incorporate the Manufacturers' and Mechanics' Bank of the Northern Liberties of the county of Philadelphia, as requires the bonus of those banks, respectively, to be paid into the state treasury on the twenty-third day of April, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-three, and within one year after the last mentioned bank goes into operation, be, and the same are hereby repealed, and that the bonus to be paid by each of the said banks shall be paid into the state treasury in the following manner, to wit: one third of each bonus shall be paid on the twenty-third day of April, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-three; one other third of each bonus on the twenty-third day of April, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-four; and the residue of each bonus on the twenty-third day of April, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-five.
